As we enter more deeply into the Lenten season, hopefully our awareness of God continues to crystallize. Our life, our Being, is His gracious gift to us. All that exists is of God, and we observe Lent to deepen our knowledge and faith in this most sublime mystery. We engage and indulge in our chosen bodily and spiritual disciplines in atonement for sin, yes. This is so we may be emptied of self in order to be more receptive to His grace.

Today's first reading recounts the revelation of the Ten Commandments of God to Moses on Mount Sinai. As all the Covenants prepare the ground and point toward the New and Everlasting Covenant in Christ, the Ten Commandments reveal in their own, explicit way, the Will of God. Yet, they are commanded for us to use in freedom, not under coercion. The Ten Commandments make known the Eternal Law of God, written on every human heart is what we call the Natural Law of God. We term it 'Natural Law' because His Eternal Law is connatural to it. The reparative nature of Old Testament Covenants exhorts humanity to orient their hearts toward God and correct the waywardness that results from the folly of sin.

The revelation to Moses and Israel was a big deal. Today, they seem to be more and more disposable. Yet, they will always stand as the guardrails for our life in faith, and will remain essential for a life of grace. This life of grace is attained by hearkening to the Eternal Law of God written on our human hearts as His Natural Law. It is foundational for a stable and just society as well.

It is good to keep this in mind as our season of fasting, prayer, and alms giving continues forward. It serves to remind us of God's evident desire to allow ourselves to live in connatural covenant with Him through His grace and our efforts. He spared no expense to redeem us, and as we know, He has been active throughout human history to ensure we have recourse to His love. We must seek it and that is what Lent helps us to do.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (2:13-25)

R. Glory to you, O Lord.

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, *Zeal for your house will consume me*. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.

While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.

Angel Lee Cronen Memorial Fund



Lenten Regulations

Fast & Abstinence Rules: ASH WEDNESDAY and GOOD FRIDAY are days of FAST and ABSTINENCE which means no meat and only one FULL meal—no eating between meals. Liquids are allowed. This pertains to those from age 18 to 59.

All Fridays of Lent are days of ABSTINENCE (no meat) for ages 14 onward. There is no obligation to fast the other days of Lent, but voluntary acts of penance and self-denial are recommended. Remember, the 40 days of Lent for fasting and giving up do not include Sundays which are days of rest, leisure, and joy in the Lord. The Christian faithful are to do penance through prayer, fasting, abstinence and by exercising works of piety and charity. The obligation does not apply to those whose health or ability to work would be seriously affected. People in doubt about fast or abstinence should consult their pastor.

Easter Duty Obligation: Catholics are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept should be fulfilled during the Easter Season (Ash Wednesday—Pentecost). Catholics are also bound to confess serious sin at least once a year, but this is not limited to the Lenten/Easter season and more frequent confession is recommended.
