

"Who is this Christ? Is he like you?"

Perhaps you've heard this story, often attributed to the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta. A sick man asked her this question, as he marveled at her tireless service to himself and others in the name of someone named Jesus Christ.

"He is nothing like me," the saint is said to have answered. "But I hope I am like him."

Though the authenticity of this exchange cannot be verified, its message rings perfectly true: all the value of our stewardship lies in its relativity to the one in whose name we perform it.

Consider the figure of John the Baptist — a magnificent, towering character even purely from a literary or historical perspective. A martyr who fed on wild locusts and boldly spoke truth to power — a man so great some mistook him for the Messiah.

But why is he great? Because he prepared the way. All his accomplishments and escapades mean nothing if they are taken out of the context of salvation history. He only makes sense relative to Christ — and this is exactly as he wanted it. "One worthier than I is coming," he insists. And because of that humility and that total embrace of God's will, he is given one of the greatest honors in the New Testament — he baptizes the Son of God.

Let's examine our lives in the light of their relativity to Christ. How do we prepare the way? When Christ comes to us, what do we do? How do we leave ourselves open to be actors in God's plan?

FROM THE PASTOR

Everyday a lot of people have the chance to bathe or shower with clean water, brush their teeth and get dressed in clean clothes, yet not all have that gift or simple necessity. This weekend we celebrate the **Baptism of the Lord**, which officially ends the glorious Christmas season. We must acknowledge that Jesus was not baptized as an infant, for he was a young man willing and ready to embrace the incredible mission he came to fulfill as desired by the Heavenly Father. We believe that as God's Son, Jesus, was born without sin and came to save us. We might ponder, why do we need to be baptized? The Church's explanation might be that while an infant or a very young child is not yet capable of personal sin, by virtue of his or her human nature, the child's life unfortunately has been tainted by original sin. Hence, baptism as a sacrament is an opportunity to be welcomed into the Christian community, cleansed from original sin, claimed as a child of God, anointed with sacred chrism and the Holy Spirit. The child or recipient is blessed with God's grace and love to grow as a disciple of Jesus in the ways of virtue by the example of the parents and godparents along with the support of the community. Hence, that is why sacraments, even baptism, are not a private celebration! The journey of faith begins and the child is recognized by a name, attains a new Christian identity, and belongs to God. When listening to the Scriptures, they highlight the desire of God, who will bless his servant, whom he has chosen. In a more focused way, Luke's gospel account tells us that the people were excited and wondering if John the Baptist was Jesus, but he told them that he was not, as he baptized Jesus and other people. John, knowing he was unworthy but humbly obeyed the command of Jesus, baptized the Savior with water and assured the people that one greater than he would baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire. In addition, we are mindful that Jesus did not need to be baptized, yet he was baptized to make the waters holy and desired to be in solidarity with repentant sinners. However, the final act of awesome power was revealed following the baptism of the Lord, as we read: "Heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." With great emphasis, God the Father offers us one more image of the Incarnation—a place where Jesus is Lord and Son of God, Savior and Redeemer, revealed fully human and divine, that we might become recipients of salvation. Even though most of us can't remember our baptism, we might still praise God for this beginning of faith and the empowerment of the Holy Spirit that enables us to be also beloved children of God, because Jesus came to dwell with us and help us on the faith journey. Bless yourself with holy water and renew your pledge to follow Christ, as the Priest, Prophet, and King, who hopes we can flourish as holy people in the world!
