"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness." Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of "varieties of tongues" might falter in the expression of wisdom.

Think about the wedding at Cana and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, "Do whatever he tells you," her words

apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers — do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother herself and give encouragement to follow God's word?

Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.

FROM THE PASTOR

What makes for an enjoyable celebration? Many folks would probably affirm that special beverages, delicious and bountiful food, gifts, a welcoming atmosphere, music and countless guests all impact celebrations, whether holidays, birthday parties and weddings. This weekend we recognize the Wedding Feast in Cana as we celebrate the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time. Backtracking a bit, Epiphany in the Eastern Church is actually older than the Christmas celebration because it includes several feasts together: Christmas, Epiphany, the Baptism of Jesus and the Wedding Feast at Cana. The Roman Catholic Church later designated a special day to honor the Lord's Birth, followed by the other feasts. Our liturgical cycle this year enables us to hear about the first miracle of Jesus at the wedding in Cana. This awesome account of the wedding is only recorded in John's gospel, and it happened very early in the public ministry of Jesus. Although we are not told if there was some special relationship to either the bride or groom, we know that Jesus, his mother Mary and the disciples were present at this wedding celebration, which also brought the entire community together. We learn that the wine ran short, and Mary approaches Jesus, seeking his help so as to prevent embarrassment for the couple and their families. The response of Jesus, the Master, almost appears rude for he says to his mother, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." Mary encourages Jesus and the servers to act promptly, for she said: "Do whatever he tells you." Then abundance of wine and not food becomes a reality! The Son of God instructs the servers to fill the large jars of water and draw some for the guests. The most amazing detail of this miraculous story is the quantity and quality of the wine that Jesus makes from the water, for each of the six stone jars contained 20-30 gallons. This was indeed a party and miracle, as the wine tasted even better. The wedding reception must have lasted for awhile. Nonetheless, the good news for us is that God and Jesus have incredible capabilities to exceed our hopes and expectations. At the banquet of the Last Supper, the Spirit transforms bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ, and this is holy and miraculous food and drink are but a foretaste of the heavenly wedding feast that awaits us because of Jesus' dying and rising for us. Truly, the wedding at Cana offers us a glimpse of Jesus' divinity, but it also anticipates the hour when He will attain final victory on the cross and at his resurrection. Have you ever been to a wedding celebration, and the reception was more than you ever imagined? Do you ever savor the abundance of God's grace or love that comes to you when you least expect it?
