

One of the things about Scripture is that even the smallest word and shortest phrase can be critical to the overall message. When you take a quiet moment to rest with the Word, you find how quickly the most mundane sentence can reach out and grab you, pulling you into a deeper contemplation of some truth you hadn't even considered until then.

But we often fail to act as the Israelites in the Book of Nehemiah, standing before the Water Gate "listening attentively." Whether it's at Mass during the Liturgy of the Word or at home poring over the Bible, time after time we find ourselves less mindful than we could be. Our ears accept the sounds of the words and our eyes glance over the shape of the letters.

But are we mindful — truly?

The best answer is hopefully at least sometimes. There are always tasks to be completed, problems weighing on our minds that we can't quite give over to God. We lose ourselves in these things instead of in Scripture. We "clock in" with Bible reading instead of "diving in."

We can never forget that the words of the Lord are spirit and life. They are the soil that quickens the seed of all stewardship. There is no mindfulness, no prayer, no graciousness, no gratitude or accountability or sense of commitment unless there is the Word.

So let us pray today for mindfulness, that our every action will be grounded in the law of God — giving it true spirit and life. — *Tracy Earl Welliver*

FROM THE PASTOR

Whether we hear latest information about COVID, news about the economy, or even possible predictions of which team might make the Super Bowl this year, we have to digest a lot of communication pieces or opinions which can be challenging. It's possible that part of our culture is overwhelmed with the multitude of messages, and some folks might be addicted to desiring more information or want to respond immediately to the cellphone sound. On a spiritual level, this experience may impact or impede our ability to hear God's voice and realize his ways of truth, wisdom or love for us. Listening and being able to hear God's speaking to us is at the heart of the Scriptures on the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time. The first reading from the book of Nehemiah, (governor of Israel) describes his attempts to help the people who return from the Babylonian exile. Their cities had been destroyed as well as their places of worship, and he led with serious efforts in rebuilding their lives with what he thought was most important—their faith in God. Hence, the passage tells about the assembly called by Nehemiah, and the people are to gather to listen to the priest-scribe Ezra read and interpret God's word to them. There is a possibility that the message was from one of the first five books (the Torah), and we gain a sense of how the people responded with reverence and enthusiasm for we read: "Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden platform that had been made for the occasion. He opened the scroll so that all the people might see it—for he was standing higher up than any of the people—and, he opened it and all the people rose. Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people, their hands raised high, answered, 'Amen, amen!'" Encouraging the people, he gave a brief commentary and the people were instructed and dismissed with these words: "Today is holy to the Lord God. Do not be sad, and do not weep....Do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the Lord must be your strength!" The gospel passage from Luke articulates a similar passage as Jesus begins his public ministry in Nazareth, for Jesus reads from the scroll and declares the passage as "fulfilled in your hearing" identifying himself with the servant in Isaiah's writings. The people who witnessed Jesus' teaching were stunned and troubled by his words, struggling to incorporate God's wisdom into daily living. If we are honest, there might be instances where God's word also challenges us and causes us to be speechless or confused. However, Jesus always invites us into his mission with him on the path toward holiness, service and salvation. Did you hear the Master call each one of us to commit to our faith and re-dedicate our lives as disciples, who strive to overcome obstacles? Where do you sense God beckoning you to be joyful or courageous each day in your prayer, work or leisure?

Thank you for supporting the annual Knights of Columbus, One Rose, One Life Campaign! This is an excellent way to honor the Pro-life cause as we acknowledged the unfortunate anniversary of Roe vs Wade Supreme court decision, which legalized abortion in USA. Your prayers are equally important for our leaders and country to foster greater respect for human life in all stages, from conception until natural death.
