



I think the real challenge of evangelization in the modern age is the reality that pretty much everyone has already heard of Jesus Christ — or, at least, they think they have.

To our 21st-century eyes, the angel who shared news of the birth of Jesus with the shepherds had an easy job. All he had to do was announce it.

Our baptism compels us to do the same — to announce the coming of Christ over and over again, always and everywhere. But our audience is not a group of illiterate shepherds in ancient Judea. Our audience is a world that has heard so much about Jesus they often claim weariness of his name. So how do we do it? If we walk into a crowd of strangers and tell them we want to talk about Jesus, their reaction will probably be either "I already know about Jesus, thanks," or "I've heard of him, and based on the behavior of those who claim to follow him, I'm really not interested in hearing more."

Because in the end, our very lives are how we "announce his salvation" in the present day. We announce it in our actions to strangers. We announce it in our treatment of people who have wronged us. We announce it in our interactions with those who disagree with us.

How long had the coming of the Messiah been foretold to the Israelites? So long that, no doubt, many of them despaired of his coming altogether. So, God had to give them a sign: "You will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger."

Now we are the sign.

The world has heard of Christ by now. But have they all seen him? It's our job to show them.

## FROM THE PASTOR

Finally, after four weeks of waiting and preparation, the festive season of Christmas and celebrating the birth of God's Son has arrived. God's Word on Christmas accents various themes and here are few examples: joy, redemption, light, grace, mercy, discoveries, rejoicing, silence, peace, beauty, love and salvation. Many greetings from cards and songs describe similar perspectives. At the Masses, the Scriptures are different in comparison from the vigil Mass, Midnight and even on Christmas day, yet God's plan to save humanity is evident and mysterious. How could an infant child born in a manger of a young virgin be the Savior of the world? Why do foreigners or the most insignificant also want to see this child with their own very eyes? One possibility might be articulated in this long sentence from St. Paul to Titus on Christmas morning, for we read: "Beloved: When the kindness and generous love of God our savior appeared, not because of any righteous deeds we had done but because of his mercy, he saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, who he richly poured out on us through Jesus Christ our savior, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life." Furthermore, we might wonder why a baby gets all the attention. With Jesus Christ, it is no different. Pope Francis offers this explanation: "A great joy in life is the birth of a child. It is something extraordinary and changes everything. It brings an excitement that makes us think nothing of weariness, discomfort and sleepless nights, for it fills us with a great, incomparable happiness. That is what Christmas is: Jesus' birth is the "newness" enabling us to be reborn each year and to find in him the strength needed to face every trial. Why? Because his birth is for us—for me, for you, for all of us. "For" is a word that appears again and again in our readings: "For us a child is born" (Isaiah 9:5), Jesus "gave himself for us" (Titus 2:14), and "For to you is born this day a Savior." (Luke 2:11) For you, for me for everyone!" It is my hope that Christmas fills your life with upmost grace, joy and peace as you gather with family or friends. Recalling that Mary treasured all the events in her heart, think about what God wants you to treasure as you honor the "Newborn King." In prayer, where might the Lord Jesus free you from any burdens so that darkness does not overwhelm you? How might I express gratitude for God's gift of his Son to the world? Lastly, remember that Christmas is more than a day, so rejoice and find ways to open up presents and God's love in surprising ways!

**Thank you to all our great volunteers** who helped decorate our churches for the glorious celebration of Christmas and to all our liturgical ministers, servers, singers and musicians who assisted us to worship with faith, hope and grace! I am also very **grateful** for your financial support to the parishes and your prayers, gifts and kindness!
