

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Paragraph 798 of the Catechism testifies that the Holy Spirit "works in many ways to build up the Body in charity: ...by the many special graces (called 'charisms'), by which he makes the faithful 'fit and ready to undertake various tasks and offices for the renewal and building up of the Church."

I have seen firsthand that this is true. As we begin this new year, the Holy Spirit has gifted us with a new surge of parish servant-leaders in our pastoral and finance councils, festival and synod committees, and school advisory teams. I have been humbled to see these groups come together with such zeal and dedication. Most of the individuals on these teams are people you already know as generous givers of their gifts, but it is in submitting these gifts to and for the good of Christ's Church that their gifts are elevated to true *charisms*.

I bring up these leadership groups because I want to encourage all parishioners to keep an eye on the lower east hallway (outside of Marian Hall). In particular, you will find:


- Team photos, so you know who's who





ST. RAPHAEL CATHOLIC SCHOOL ST. MAR 20 - C + M + B - 22

In 4th grade religion class, the 4th graders used blessed chalk to "chalk" the classroom doors of the school with the inscription:

"20 - C + M + B - 22". and then said a prayer to bless the room.

This time honored tradition occurs at the Epiphany or beginning of the new year. The letters have two meanings.

First, they represent the initials of the Magi - Caspar, Malchior, and Balthazar - who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, *Christus mansionem benedicat*: "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "22" at the end mark the year. Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless those classrooms so marked and that He stay with those who dwell therein throughout the entire year.
