

A Message from Joan Foley, Director of Religious Education

Dear St. Francis Parishioners

In Father Olson's absence I was asked to write a message for the bulletin this week. My name is Joan Foley. I am a long time member of St. Francis and have served as the Director of Religious Education for St. Francis for close to 13 years. My job entails organizing the Wednesday Religious Ed. Classes for grades 1-10 as well as Sunday School, much of the Adult Education, and a week long summer event called Totus Tuus.

I'm sure most of you are aware that our parish runs on the volunteerism of so many parish members who quietly take care of one specific thing or another without anyone noticing. I would like to take this opportunity to focus on one such group of parishioners, the volunteer Religious Ed. Teachers. These volunteers are committed to taking time to prepare and come every Wednesday evening to teach the children about the Love of Jesus and His Catholic Church. What could be more important than that?

Teaching a Rel. Ed. Class is not always an easy task but it can be very rewarding. If you ask those teachers who have been doing this for a long time, they will tell you that every year's class is different depending on the size of the class and the mixture of personalities! I love to hear the teachers describe how their classes went, especially when they tell me how their students were engaged in their class and how they were interested and excited about what they were learning. Believe it or not, I hear that scenario quite often. That uplifting feeling is the teacher's reward, as they do not get paid.

Since I started this job, there has been an explosion of good Catholic Resources made available, that aims at helping catechists/teachers prepare to teach the weekly lessons without spending hours preparing ahead of time, as in the past. Our parish is also very blessed to have the school rooms available for the individual classes. Many parishes struggle for adequate space. All of these things help to make it possible for our volunteer teachers to come and teach.

I, and all of the teachers, would agree that the best Religious Ed. Program cannot take the place of the parents' role of teaching the faith. Children learn what they live! St. Francis has great families with really good kids! It has been so exciting to see so many more families attending Sunday Masses and engaged in many of the other activities in our parish in addition to the Wednesday Classes. Keep it up and encourage others to come as well!

In closing, I want to commend all the Religious Ed. Teachers, (including my substitute teachers) for their commitment in sharing their talent, time and effort in teaching the "Love of Jesus" to our youth! They are truly making a difference!!!






