

The Pastor's Toolbox

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

I have heard priests teach about the Trinity, and one comment universally declared was, "If at the end of this presentation you understand the Trinity, then I haven't done an adequate job teaching about it." To be true, the Holy Trinity is one of the great mysteries of our faith. Now, I love a great mystery, but a mystery of faith isn't quite the same as a Sherlock Holmes' mystery. Rather, a mystery of faith is a truth about the nature of God which surpasses human reason. This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, and after read-

ing this Sunday's scripture readings, I am more affirmed that God has a plan, Jesus has already won, and the Holy Spirit empowers us to share in the mission of Jesus Christ to spread the Gospel, the Good News. Turn the page to discover what I mean.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Spirit

I believe that God has a plan, Jesus has already won, and the Holy Spirit empowers us to share in the mission of Jesus Christ to spread the Gospel,

God, The Creator: The First Reading from Proverbs 8:22–31 poetically relates God's plan and His creation of the world. In today's scripture passage, we hear Woman Wisdom speak one of her longest speeches in the Book of Proverbs. Wisdom, personified, was beside God as He created the world. She testified to this creation with words that jump off the page: "I was his delight", "playing before him", and "found delight in the human race". It reads like an introduction to a great love story, a story which continues in today's Responsorial Psalm, Psalm 8. The psalmist, David, writes of Man, "You have made him little less than the angels, and crowned him with glory and honor." (Ps 8:6) Jesus Christ is the perfect fulfillment of this verse because Jesus was humbled before he was

glorified. The psalm bridges the First and Second Readings today in that we who are created to participate in this story of salvation will also be humbled *and* glorified.

Jesus Christ, Beloved Redeemer: And so, today's Second Reading from the Letter to the Romans (Rom 5:1-5) offers hope to the disciple who, through the struggles and trials of life, develops endurance, "and endurance, proven character, and proven character, hope, and hope does not disappoint, *because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.*" (Rom 5:4-5, emphasis added) Yes, we will endure trials, but through our trials we develop our spiritual muscle, and this spirituality shapes us and molds us in conformity to the will of God. Jesus has already won, and we share in his victory over sin and death.

The Holy Spirit, the Love between the Father and the Son: In today's Gospel Reading from the Gospel of St. John, Jesus told his disciples he would send the Holy Spirit to sanctify us, help us, and guide us. The Lord sent the Holy Spirit to help us grow in love and faith to God and one another. We need not fear because God is with us...*always*. So take courage as you spread the Good News!

God has a plan, and his plan includes you. If you were the only person to have ever lived, Jesus would have died, just for *you*. Through our baptism we are called to be sharers in Christ mission. Armed with this truth, go boldly and live your story of intrigue and wonder, shining your light before others.






