## From Father Shofner

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There are many things in the spiritual life that are often misunderstood – the nature of the sacraments, the moral law, the seeming inconsistencies we find in Scripture, etc. But of them all, I find that the one that trips up more people than anything else is the simple notion of LOVE. In our culture today, love is defined in a relativistic sort of way, that is, “I love you to the extent that I allow you to pursue whatever you think is good”. The problem with this, of course, is that what one person thinks is good for them, another person sees as detrimental – for example, an alcoholic may see another drink as good for them because it helps them cope with the problems of life, while another sees it as causing harm to them and their loved ones as they see their addiction spiral out of control. Or we might consider the child who sees no problem with playing in the street, while their parents scold them for putting themselves in danger. Both the alcoholic and the child in these cases may believe that others don’t love them because they’re not allowing them to pursue what they want, but the reality is that true love is being shown by those who are attempting to safeguard them from harm.

So what is love? If we were to adopt the definition that many hold to, then love is simply tender emotions, while others see it as doing no harm to others, while still others see it simply as tolerating another’s actions. In the Scriptures, we find a fuller picture – St. Paul maintains that love is the fulfillment of the law (Romans 13:8), and Jesus Himself says that love for God is the highest command, followed second only by the love of neighbor as oneself (Matthew 22:34-40). We look at this tradition, then, and have to conclude that love consists in giving our lives completely to God, not just in tender affection, but in loving surrender of our mind, heart, soul and strength.

St. Teresa of Avila (1515-1582) added yet another layer to this reflection when she shared her thoughts on the nature of love in her spiritual classic *Interior Castle*. She recognizes that, for all the many ways we think we are loving others, we so often fail to love as we ought. And she comes to the conclusion that *“perhaps we do not know what love is: it would not surprise me a great deal to learn this, for love consists, not in the extent of our happiness, but in the firmness of our determination to try to please God in everything, and to endeavor, in all possible ways, not to offend Him, and to pray Him ever to advance the honor and glory of His Son and the growth of the Catholic Church. Those are the signs of love; do not imagine that the important thing is never to be thinking of anything else and that if your mind becomes distracted all is lost.”*

I think St. Teresa hits on an aspect of love that many times we overlook. Often, we’re looking for love to bring us pleasant feelings – the happier we feel, the more love has taken hold of our heart. But she suggests something different – that it’s *the firmness of our will to please God* that shows our love. This is consistent with the notion of love that is advanced by our faith – love is not dependent

on emotion, but is a *choice*. When couples get married, for example, they make the vow to love in this way, not just in good times when they feel happy, but at all times, good and bad, when they may not feel like loving their spouse. St. Teresa explains that love is ultimately a choice to want what God wants – and what He wants most is the glory of His Son Jesus and the building up of His Kingdom on earth.

We may feel like we’re falling short of desiring this above all things. But the consoling aspect of St. Teresa’s words lies in her encouragement not to be discouraged in our efforts. Should our minds wander in a moment of prayer, for example, do not be discouraged because our thoughts do not make up the entirety of our love for God: “Do not imagine that...if your mind wanders all is lost.” The important thing is to consider where our heart and will are. Do we still truly desire what God desires? Or are we just “going through the motions”? Do we sincerely want what our lips speak every time we lift up the Lord’s Prayer: “Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven”? If we do, then we are loving God, and it changes everything. Love then guides our words, thoughts and actions, and we pursue what will make our life pleasing to Him. Then we have surrendered to God, we have given our life completely to Him. No greater gift can we give to God than this! In this is love!
