

## From Father Shofner

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I don't know if you're familiar with the Evangelical Christian doctrine of the rapture. It states that near the end of time, the righteous who are living on earth will be "raptured", or taken up body and soul, into Heaven. They will escape the final tribulations (i.e., chastisements, punishments) that are predicted to come upon the earth, and will enter into Heavenly glory in the form that all of God's saints will enjoy after the final judgment. The *Left Behind* series of books and movies from the early 2000s dramatizes this teaching.

Catholics (and most mainline Protestant denominations) do not teach the rapture as part of their doctrine. Rather, Catholics teach that the just and the unjust will coexist on earth until the end of time, when they will be separated only at the final judgment (cf. Matthew 13:24-30). However, one prominent Catholic theologian suggests that Catholics *do* believe in a kind of rapture, only in a very limited sense.

First, we recognize that Scripture describes two individuals who were taken up into Heaven body and soul. 2 Kings 2:1-12 describes how the prophet Elijah was taken up in a chariot of fire, with Elisha as witness. And Hebrews 11:5 states that the holy man Enoch was pleasing to God and so was "taken up" and did not see death. (Some have even suggested that Jude 1:9 alludes to the body of Moses being taken up into Heaven after his death.)

Catholics believe as a matter of divine revelation that God *also* assumed the body and soul of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven at the end of her life. We know this event as the Assumption, which we celebrate this weekend, August 15. While Scripture does not explicitly describe the event of her Assumption, it is fitting, given our belief that Mary was immaculately conceived (that is, conceived without the stain of original sin) – when the angel greeted her with the news that she would conceive Jesus in her womb, he said, "Hail, Mary, full of grace". It was a declaration that Mary's soul was so filled with God's grace that no sin could touch her heart, thus leaving her perfectly pure in God's eyes. It is fitting, then, as a sinless vessel, that she would be freed from the punishment for sin, which is death and the grave, and be taken up (assumed) into Heaven through the power of Christ.

What a joyous and hope-filled teaching of our faith! The Blessed Virgin Mary is enjoying even now the fullness of Heaven, which we hope to enjoy at the end of time when our bodies are finally reunited with our souls (as it is now, only our souls enter into glory at the time of our death). But in this beautiful Solemnity of the Assumption, we get a foretaste of what we can one day expect if we remain faithful. We celebrate the power of God that worked within Mary's soul. And we celebrate the power of God that continues to work within our own souls to forgive us our sins, enlighten us with the truth of His Son Jesus Christ, guide us in the ways of holiness and truth, and bring us to eternal life.

The Solemnity of the Assumption is one of a handful of holy days of obligation throughout the year. However, because this feast falls on Sunday this year, the obligation to attend Mass is combined with the Sunday obligation (meaning that we only have to fulfill our regular Sunday obligation this year – we don't have to attend any extra Masses).

We praise God for His faithfulness toward us, that He would open up the gates of His Kingdom and allow us a path to enter in! We call upon all the saints and angels for their prayers and assistance, especially the Virgin Mary. Blessed Mary, assumed into Heaven, pray for us!

### We Need Teachers for Religious Education

Thank you to those who have answered the call to serve as a catechists for this upcoming year! If you are still discerning if this is the right ministry for you, here are a few points to consider. There are six points I'd like to focus on over the next few weeks. To begin, some of the expectations of a catechist include:

#### 1. **AFFIRM THE TEACHING OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH:**

As a representative of our parish, your role is to help students trust in the authority and teachings of the Church that Jesus Himself established. By facilitating discussion and dialogue, it will be important for students to know that your Catholic faith is important to you but that you don't judge them for what they believe. You accept them as they are but you also provide encouragement for them to grow in their spiritual life.

#### 2. **STRENGTHEN THE AUTHORITY OF PARENTS:**

Teenagers naturally "push back" against their parents as they are in the process of establishing their independence. This can be a challenging time for parents and they need to know that you are an ally and that you desire to strengthen the relationship they have with their teen. That being said, it is also important for students to know that what they share in the group or class will not get back to their parents or to peers outside the group, unless they share something that falls into the area of "mandatory reporting." This confidentiality gives them the freedom to open up about their thoughts, doubts, and struggles. They may even share struggles they have in their relationship with their parents. You want to listen patiently to them while giving their parents the benefit of the doubt.

#### 3. **ENGAGE PARENTS:**

Parents are the primary teachers of their children's faith. We as catechists are called to support both the parents and the church in teaching the next generation of our church. We will be encouraging students of all ages to communicate what they learned with their parents. The confirmation students will have a Parent Sheet that will be emailed out after every class as a recap of what the session was about. The stronger the family, the stronger the church!




## STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

The Bible in a Year Podcast is one of the most popular podcasts of 2021. Bible in a Year, produced by the Catholic group Ascension Press, is hosted by Fr. Mike Schmitz, a well-known Catholic priest and public speaker who directs the young-adult ministry in the Diocese of Duluth, Minn. Each episode is about 25 minutes in length and features Fr. Schmitz — who refers to himself and is better known to his thousands of listeners as Fr. Mike — reading Scripture aloud and exploring its historical context and theological meaning. During the first week of episodes, he has read through several chapters of the Book of Genesis, as well as a number of the Psalms and some chapters of the books of Job and Proverbs. We'd like to invite you to join in with a number of other parishioners who have already started the podcast. It's free and personally, very worthwhile. Fr. Mike Schmitz is very knowledgeable, easy to listen to, inspiring, and follows each reading with a short explanation so you really understand the historical timeline, meaning, and the special love that God has for us. You can listen each day or at your own pace, so no pressure to "catch up". You'll get so much out of the podcasts that you will look forward to the next one.
