## From Father Shofner

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I pray that your Christmas was very blessed, that you enjoyed the presence of loved ones, and that the joy of Christ's birth may remain with you always! We are now in the Christmas Season, a period of time that extends from Christmas (December 25) through the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (January 9). It is a time to continue to celebrate our Lord's Nativity with open and loving hearts.

This weekend, the Sunday following Christmas, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, a time to look to the life and love shared among Jesus, Mary and Joseph as the model for our own family life. The holiness and love that was present in their home is what our own families strive for, as challenging as it may be. These days families face many threats to its integrity—alcohol and drug addiction, pornography and infidelity, domestic abuse, divorce, neglect, and busy schedules that don't allow families to spend time together. What is the remedy for strengthening the family once again? Following the example of the Holy Family and calling upon the grace of God through prayer to help families in their specific struggles. It requires a family to be attentive to one another's needs and contribute their gifts and efforts to building up the home. Pope John II once observed that "the future of the world and of the Church passes through the family", which plays a vital role in the world by raising children well and being a model to others of mutual love, service and respect.

On September 26, 2015, when Pope Francis was in Philadelphia for the Festival of Families as part of the World Meeting of Families, he gave a beautiful catechesis on the family that opens our eyes to the beauty of family life:

"All the love God has in Himself, all the beauty God has in Himself, all the truth God has in Himself, He entrusts to the family. A family is truly a family when it is capable of opening its arms to receive all that love... God came into the world in a family. And He could do this because that family was a family with a heart open to love, a family whose doors were open. We can think of Mary, a young woman. She couldn't believe it: 'How can this be?' But once it was explained to her, she obeyed. We think of Joseph, full of dreams for making a home; then along comes this surprise that he doesn't understand. He accepts, he obeys. And in the loving obedience of this woman, Mary, and this man, Joseph, we have a family into which God comes. God always knocks on the doors of our hearts. He likes to do that. He goes out from within. But do you know what He likes best of all? To knock on the doors of families. And to see families that are united, families that love, families that bring up their children, educating them and helping them to grow, families that build a society of goodness, truth and beauty."

I pray that the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph may be an inspiration and a model for you as you strive to deepen in the love expressed in your own family. Recognize that God wants to be present in the home in an explicit way – make room for Him. And remember that, for all the needs that each of your family members has, nothing is more powerful than entrusting those needs to our Father in Heaven through prayer. He can work wonders. He is in control. Happy Feast of the Holy Family!

St. Anne's students had the pleasure of learning more about Christmas trees from Scott and Luke Wilson, of Brewery Hill Christmas Tree Farm. To the Wilson family, a Christmas tree is a centerpiece of the home this time



of year, representing hope and love.

Scott Wilson loves nature and says it gives him great satisfaction to watch trees grow.

- During the third week of April each year, they plant about 3,000 trees.
- \* They can plant between 1,000 and 1,200 per acre.
- What kind of trees they plant where, depends on what type of soil the tree needs.
- \* The trees they plant are 5 years old when they are put in the ground. They need to grow for at least 8 years, which means the trees we have in our homes are likely at least 13 years old!
- During the growing years, these trees need to be fertilized, mowed around, and sheared to create an optimal shape.
- \* The Wilson's are currently growing about 20,000 trees.
- \* This year, they sold 1200 trees in 5 days!

Students also heard the book, The Legend of the Christmas Tree, by Rick Osborne. "Boniface explained to the people that just as the tree had three corners but was still one tree, so God is one God who exists in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit."

#### **Year-End Donations**

If you are planning your year-end donations, please be aware that in order to be posted to 2021, all donations must be received in the parish office by December 31, 2021. The parish office will be open until 12:00 Noon on December 31, 2021.

#### <u>Giving – Tax Planning</u>

The 2021 year is quickly coming to an end, and so it's time to plan for any year-end donations.

The strategy of donating to the church directly from an IRA after age 72 is still available. The donation allows those age 72 and over to give money to the church directly from their IRAs in a tax-advantageous manner. This allows IRA owners who have attained age 72 to distribute money directly from the IRA to the church and not have to pay the income tax on those dollars. The amount of the contribution is not counted as income, thus it does not get included in Gross Income when determining the amount of your Social Security that is taxed. In addition, the qualified charitable contribution (QCD) counts toward the required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year.

To take advantage of this tax-saving donation, please talk with your financial planner about donating your distribution from your IRA to St. Anne's Church.
