### From Father Shofner

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Thank you to all who gave so generously to St. Anne's Parish and School throughout 2021! Through your gifts, we were able to provide for our ongoing ministry needs and address regular administrative and maintenance issues, in addition to making significant headway on introducing new ministry opportunities. We are looking forward to what 2022 will bring!

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, on which we commemorate the visit of the Magi to the manger. Most of us are familiar with the story, either from images we have seen or from Christmas hymns. It's an interesting story, the details of which we remember may or may not be completely accurate. For example, while the Scriptures don't actually tell how many Magi visited the manger, we assume there were three—and in fact, tradition has given them the names of Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar. We assume there were three because the story tells of three gifts being offered to the baby Jesus-gold, frankincense and myrrh. Likewise, we tend to think that the visit of the Magi took place shortly after Jesus' birth, following soon after the shepherds made their visit. But scholars suggest that the Magi may have visited much later, perhaps even when Jesus was as old as two years. They suggest this because it would still have Jesus within the age range of those boys that Herod was seeking to slaughter, and because Scripture states that they entered into a house, not a manger. Mary and Joseph would have taken time to find a more permanent shelter after the birth of Jesus.

Regardless of the details of the story, the purpose of the Magi's visit is the same – they came to adore the newborn King of the Jews and to offer Him gifts (interesting, since the Magi were not Jews and thus did not have a vested interest in the Messiah). They knew that there was something special about this child – even the stars in the heavens were attesting to this. So the Magi traveled from their countries in the east, thus representing the manifestation of the Christ-child to the nations. When Jesus was born, He was given to all nations and all peoples – no one is excluded from His grace. And all peoples are invited to seek Him out, adore Him, and receive from His abundant gifts and blessings.

It seems this year, more than any other, one particular image has popped up time and time again. I have found lots of variations of this simple image, but the main image is the same – the Magi traveling by camel, guided by the light of the star, as they make their way to the manger to see the newborn Jesus. A single phrase tells the entire story: "Wise men still seek Him".

How true this is! Even though over 2000 years have passed since the birth of Jesus, we still seek Him. If we are wise enough to recognize our need for Him, then we will seek Him. We will even go to great lengths, as the Magi did, to find Him. We may not have to travel hundreds or thousands of miles over hills and valleys, but we may have to traverse the ups and downs of our doubts and fears. We may have to go through rough patches of not feeling that we're making any progress in our faith journey. But if we are wise and recognize that our journey is guided by the light of a star that will lead us to Jesus, then we will reach our destination. The journey is never in vain. Yes, wise men still seek Him.

As we celebrate the birth of Jesus and adore Him with our lives, we renew our efforts to seek Him out at all times, confident that we will find Him, so that we can adore Him and offer Him the gift of our life. May 2022 bring you many blessings, and may Christ act powerfully in your lives this year!
