From Father Shofner

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, when Jesus was baptized in the Jordan River by John the Baptist. It is the moment the waters were sanctified by the Holy Spirit so that they might become a very real means by which divine life is given to us, to wash away our sins and to help us to live holy lives. With this event, Baptism becomes a Sacrament of grace whose importance should not be minimalized. In fact, we should treasure the gift of faith we receive in Baptism.

Understanding what Baptism does for us is most important for our appreciation of the Sacrament. When I prepare couples for the baptism of their child, I describe the four effects of baptism in the life of the soul:

- Baptism washes away sin: While for a child, it makes sense to talk only of original sin, if an adult were to be baptized, all the sins they had committed their life would also be wiped away. This is the power of the Sacrament of Baptism! It's amazing to think that at the moment of Baptism, a parent is holding in their arms a perfect person in the eyes of God – they are in perfect relationship with God. They are saints! But while the stain of sin is washed away, we have to remember that something remains, something we call "concupiscence", which is the tendency to selfishness because sin in the world still has a negative effect on us and acts upon us.
- * **Baptism is our initial entrance into the Church**: Baptism is the first Sacrament, which gives us access to the entire sacramental life available within the Church. Furthermore, Baptism gives us a community of faith that, in one sense, fulfills our social needs, but in a deeper sense connects us to one another in a bond of fraternal love. Our Baptism calls us, then, to pray for one another and assist each other in their journey of faith and holiness, while at the same time we benefit from the prayers and assistance of all within the Body of Christ.
- * **Baptism is the first time we receive the Holy Spirit**: While the Holy Spirit is bestowed upon in each of the Sacraments, Baptism is our first introduction of the Spirit into our souls. He vitalizes our human spirit so that we may be able to live out our call to be Christians in the world. He helps us to be holy, and guides and strengthens us through the spiritual gifts.
- * In Baptism we know our identity as a child of God: While a baby may not be able to communicate with God through words, there is still a deep conversation taking place between a child and God at the moment of Baptism, because God speaks to the heart. And within the heart, God says to the child: "You are My precious son or daughter." And the child knows to whom they belong. Life, however, can introduce many challenges and threats to that knowledge—disappointments and failures and the mean comments of others can make us lose that sense of dignity and worth that are rightfully ours because of our being children of God. This is where the parents' and godparents' roles are so important, as they remind the child who they are in the eyes of God.

In Baptism a child is brought into the faith of his or her parents. And thus the role of the parents as first teachers of their child in the ways of faith cannot be underestimated. By modeling a holy life through practice of the faith, through passing on knowledge of the faith, and by living the moral life, parents prepare their children for eternal life.

We should cherish our Baptism as an immense gift from God above! And we should thank our parents and godparents for bringing us to the waters of Baptism and for following through on their promise to be an example of the faith. And most of all, let us thank God above for this powerful means to our holiness!


Minnesota Valley Action Council grants for energy assistance
