From Father Shofner

Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

This week we prepare ourselves to commemorate a somber anniversary. January 22 marks the 49th anniversary of the 1973 Roe v Wade Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion in our country. Since then, over 50 million lives have been lost due to abortion. Astounding numbers that should cause great sadness for us all.

I remember first learning about abortion when I was in a seventh grade Home Economics class. My teacher asked us to look around at the empty chairs around the room. She stated that those chairs should be filled with our classmates, but they're not, because of abortion. That simple illustration stuck with me, especially as I later considered all the implications, that potential husbands and wives of my friends were not born, that children today are deprived of friends they would have had, that we were deprived of great scientific and artistic minds.

We believe, as Christians, that life is a gift—from the beginning of creation, God formed man in His own image and breathed life into him, giving him a dignity that surpasses that of any other creature. At the moment of conception, God enters into the loving, life-giving act between man and woman, in order to create life. How do we celebrate that life? By nurturing it, loving it, giving that life what it needs to thrive. And by supporting the ones through whom God allowed this life to come into being – by supporting the mother and father. This is the work of pro-life ministries.

Pro-life work is not about condemning or shaming women who are considering an abortion or have had an abortion. It's about loving the woman and wanting her to be healed from the pain and fear she's feeling at the time of an unexpected or difficult pregnancy. It's about loving the child in the womb and wanting to give them a chance at life. The proper work of pro-life advocates is not to pit mother against child, but to save them both.


As a society and as a Church, we have to address how we can best support women who find themselves in a crisis pregnancy, women who have had an abortion, and men who are their husbands and boyfriends. We must address how to remember and honor those lives that are lost through abortion. And we must address how to form a culture that recognizes and values the humanity and dignity of the unborn.

The prophet Isaiah speaks some very powerful words today: "For Zion's sake I will not be silent, for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet." Whether it's abortion or any issue that affects the dignity of the human person, we should feel compelled to speak or act in the name of those who cannot speak or act for themselves. Whether we get properly educated on pro-life issues, get involved in the public square, or talk to those in our circle of family and friends, we can do much to further the conversation.

Living in our current times is not easy. It requires courage, not just to speak out, but to pray fervently for our nation. We have to trust that Christ is on the side of life. Just as this

weekend's Gospel teaches us, we must defer to Christ in all things – just as only Christ has the power to turn water into wine, so also only Christ has the power to transform hearts and souls. So let us do what we are called to, but place the results in His hands. Let us continue to pray for our nation, for the women suffering the fear of an unexpected pregnancy or the pain of abortion, for their husbands and boyfriends, and for the children who have been lost or are threatened by abortion.
