# From Father Shofner

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we turn our gaze toward the coming Lenten season, I invite each of you to consider how these precious days can become an opportunity to deepen your relationship with Jesus Christ. Lent is not merely a chance to “give something up” or observe a few external practices; it is an open doorway that leads us into the very heart of our faith, where we discover Christ’s invitation to draw closer, to walk with Him, and to become more like Him.

It is true that we often start this season with the best of intentions, resolving to pray more consistently, fast in meaningful ways, and commit ourselves more fully to the needs of others. Then, as the weeks wear on, life can begin to chip away at those intentions. Days get busy, priorities shift, or we lose that initial spark of enthusiasm. But here’s the good news: even small, intentional decisions can be powerful tools for growth if we let them take root in our daily routines. Establishing one sacred moment for prayer—perhaps first thing in the morning, or just before turning off the lights at night—can gradually become the anchor that keeps our hearts pointed toward the Lord. Offering one humble sacrifice, whether it’s fasting from distractions on our phones or simplifying our meals, helps us reconnect with our ultimate dependence on God. Choosing one small, concrete way to help our neighbor, whether through a kind word or a hidden act of generosity, brings the love of Christ to life within us.

When these small acts are woven into the fabric of every day, they become more than tasks to check off a Lenten to-do list. They become channels of grace, quietly reshaping our hearts so that our desire for God grows stronger than our inclination to slip back into the old patterns that keep us stagnant. Throughout these weeks, it can also help to find companions for the journey—family, friends, or fellow parishioners who share our desire to grow in Christ. An encouraging conversation or a brief check-in can make all the difference in staying faithful to the commitments you’ve prayerfully made.

The best part of engaging meaningfully in Lent is the transformation we experience by the time we arrive at Easter. Our great feast of the Resurrection is meant to be a celebration not only of Christ’s victory over death, but of our own newly strengthened bond with Him. Even if we stumble along the way, the essential thing is not to give up, but to begin again with fresh trust in God’s mercy and power. As we approach Ash Wednesday and prepare to mark our foreheads with that humble sign of repentance, let us already start asking the Lord to open our hearts wide to His invitation. If our Lenten practices can be sustained and integrated into everyday life, we will certainly rejoice in the growth that has taken place when the bright morning of Easter dawns.

May the peace of Christ be with you as we embark on this journey together. Let us walk side by side, encouraging each other, praying for one another, and supporting one another. Above all, let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, who promises that if we seek Him with all our hearts, we will truly find Him. In that seeking and finding, may we discover a new wellspring of faith, hope, and love, ready to spill over into our families, our parish, and the world around us.
