

District Construction Update

Here is a rundown of each site construction:

All buildings listed will be receiving state of the art security systems.

North Campus High School is preparing to house all 9-12th grade students.

- A 565,000 sq.ft addition of which 256,000 sq.ft. is new classroom space.
- A Field House; indoor 5-lane, track, five multi-purpose courts and walking track.
- Six outdoor, artificial turf fields; 1500 seat stadium with press box; 10-lane track.
- A new theatre.
- Scheduled to be completed with move in January 2023. The older section then renovated and completed by fall 2024.

South Campus High School to become a middle school.

- The 58,000 sq.ft. multi-use gymnasium and renovated stadium is completed.
- An eight classroom addition and storm shelter on the McKnight side of building.
- Moving the main office and entrance to the McKnight side with all new office space and closer drop off area.
- Additional renovations in the building will serve the high school students and preparations for Sunrise Middle students to move into, preparing for fall of 2024.

Early Childhood Coordinator

WBL Early Childhood provides support for families and children from birth to kindergarten. Programs include Preschool, Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE), Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE), home visits, outreach, and screening. Altogether, our programs support over 800 children.

District preschool programming serves children who are 3-4 years old by September 1. All teachers are licensed and use Creative Curriculum to create a fun and enriching environment for children to master the basic skills required for school. We have both full day and half day options to help meet a wide range of family needs.

Our ECFE classes are for families that

want to join their children in class. Parents and children meet together for half the class and then they separate to give caregivers time to learn together.

Early Childhood screening is a state requirement for kindergarten entry and should be completed between their third and fifth birthdays. It is designed to identify children who may have additional needs for support as they enter school. Screening includes both a developmental component as well as a vision and hearing screen.

In addition to formal classes, Early Childhood hosts events throughout the year. These include field trips, literacy events, playground playdates, and music/art events.



- Renovated bathrooms with privacy stalls.
- A two-room class addition on the east side.
- Repaving of the playground surface.
- Additional/improved parking spaces and area.
- Additional HVAC system.
- Update to existing water lines in building.

Otter Lake Elementary

- Renovation of the Media Center and multi-use flex space.
- Bathroom renovations with privacy stalls and improved ADA access.

Fresh Corn and Tomato Salad

Ingredients

- 3 tablespoons white wine vinegar
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- 6 ears fresh corn, shucked (or 32 oz. of canned corn)
- 2 cups red or orange grape tomatoes, halved
- 8 oz. mozzarella pearls or fresh, cut into small cubes
- 1 bunch scallions, thinly sliced
- 1 1/2 cups fresh basil leaves

STEP 1

- Whisk together the vinegar, 2 tsp salt and some pepper in a small bowl.
- Gradually whisk in the oil, starting with a few drops and then adding the rest in a steady stream, to make a smooth dressing.

STEP 2

- Shear off the corn kernels with a sharp knife over a bowl (approx. 4 cups) or the drained canned corn.
- Toss in the tomatoes, mozzarella and scallions.
- Pour the vinaigrette over the salad and toss to coat.
- Cover and let stand for at least 15 minutes and up to 2 hours.
- Before serving, tear the basil over the salad and stir.
