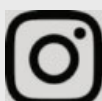

## A NOTE FROM DOUG DEBELAK

### THE CATHOLIC REASON FOR VOLUNTEERING

Pope Benedict XVI said that Christian volunteer efforts should not merely be “an expression of good will” but should be “based on a personal experience of Christ.” “He was the first to serve humanity, he freely gave his life for the good of all. That gift was not based on our merits. From this we learn that God gives us himself.” He later says that “the experience of God’s generous love challenges us and liberates us to adopt the same attitude towards our brothers and sisters: ‘You received without pay, give without pay’ (Mt 10:8). We experience this especially in the Eucharist when the Son of God, in the breaking of bread, brings together the vertical dimension of his divine gift with the horizontal dimension of our service to our brothers and sisters”. (Remarks made November 11,2011)

The question I present to you my brothers and sisters is do you volunteer? If not, why not? God calls us to be volunteers and I will give you reasons to do so. **1) Volunteering is life changing.** Your interactions with others will help and change people. Volunteering will also change you as you face new experiences. **2) Volunteering will give you a broader perspective of life and what others go through.** You will have new experiences and they impact you and how you evaluate the world. **3) Through volunteering you will develop new friendships.** Volunteering allows you to develop new relationships with others. **4) Volunteering will allow you to develop a sense of pride and better self-image.** Volunteering gives one a sense of accomplishment. **5) Volunteering makes you a better thinker and helps in decision making.** Volunteering requires sacrifice and preparation. You must learn to accommodate and make sacrifices to volunteer. **6) Volunteering will make you more generous.** Generosity is the giving of time, talent, and treasure. Volunteering allows you to see the need for your generosity and how thankful people are of your giving. **7) Your talent is needed whatever your talent is. Your talent is different than mine, but the world needs both.** St Paul writes: *We have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function...Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them” (Rom 12:4,6).* **8) Volunteering gets you involved with activities that are outside of your comfort zone.** Think of Christ, the apostles, and the saints, and how uncomfortable they may have been. Christ did not come to make us comfortable. He came to save us. When his Light and Goodness invades our lives, we are transformed by them. Our efforts as Pope Benedict said are based on a personal experience of Christ. Volunteering allows us to follow Jesus, the Way, the Truth and the Light.

Our volunteer efforts allow us to share in the carrying of the Cross. The two dimensions of the Cross are the vertical which is our relationship with God and the horizontal which is one’s relationship with others. The Cross is not complete without both dimensions. Volunteering enables us to deepen and grow our relationship with Christ while serving your brother and sisters. Look for opportunities to volunteer, look for opportunities outside of your comfort zone. God will support you. As it says in the book of Isiah 41:10 *“fear not for I am with you, be not dismayed, for I am your God I will strengthen you, I will help you.”*
