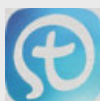

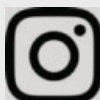

THE VISIT OF THE MAGI

This Sunday, we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. Epiphany is a Greek word which means a moment when you suddenly feel or become aware of something that is powerfully important to you - that you see below the surface to the true meaning or reality of a thing or idea. The feast of the Epiphany is our remembrance of the first demonstration of Jesus Christ as Son of God to the waiting world when He was made manifest to the three kings who had traveled to honor Him and adore Him. Because it is such an important feast day, in some countries it is the day that gifts are shared among family and friends rather than on the traditional Christmas Day as we observe it.

So, who were these three kings (or wise men) who came to see Jesus, and what was the significance of their visit? First, Scripture never tells us the names of the three kings, but tradition has it that their names were Gaspar, Balthasar, and Melichior. The three wise men were not "kings" in the normal sense of the word, they were magi. The word magi is the same root for our word magician, but the three magi of the Bible had nothing to do with magic. They were nobles who were highly educated, philosophers and teachers who had learned of the predicted coming of the Christ child from studying the Scriptures. They were watching for a sign that would reveal that the child had been born, and when the star appeared they followed it, because they believed that would lead them to the Messiah.

And lead them it did. When they arrived at the stable in Bethlehem, they found the tiny child and realized the power and the salvation that would issue forth from him. They knelt to worship the new born king and the three wise men then placed gifts near the infant; gifts of gold (for a king), frankincense (because He was God) and finally myrrh, a spice that was used in the preparation of a dead body, signifying His death on the cross for us.

Interestingly, by the 8th century, Church tradition had also come to see the three magi as kings as well. Balthasar a king of Arabia, Melichior, a king of Persia and Gaspar a king of India - hence the connection of the three magi to the royalty. Earthly kings coming to worship the King of all creation.

So, what should the feast of the Epiphany mean to us today. There are several things that people have taken the feast of the Epiphany to signal. One of those is what gifts we bring today to Christ to honor and worship Him. Perhaps, the gifts of gold, incense and myrrh are no longer important. Perhaps, the gift that is most significant to the Lord is the gift of our hearts. Our hearts turned in conversion and love to Him.

A second signal that the three magi bring to us is to always approach worldly power with a sense of discernment and care. The three magi were confronted by Herod who wanted them to return and tell him where the Christ child resided, because Herod secretly wanted to go and kill the child because of his fear and envy. In the same way, many civil authorities today, wish to downplay the gift of faith and the miracle of Christmas, in order to push us away from the active practice of pursuing God. Just as the three magi returned by a different route, so too do we steer a wide berth around those who seek to lead us away from Christ.

Third, as the wise men returned home by a "different route" so too do we travel a different route away after we have encountered Jesus. No one can come to the Lord and leave unchanged. Once we have encountered Christ we travel a different route home.

Fourth, the epiphany should signal to all of us that we are "sort-timers" here on earth. Our ultimate agenda is to be with the Lord. We know our route to Heaven is shaped and dependent upon how we live our lives here on earth. The magi learned that lesson well and adjust their lives accordingly. This epiphany we are called to remember our travel plans, our agenda, how we need to travel a different path to get to Heaven.

Have a blessed feast of the Epiphany of the Lord.

SURVIVING DIVORCE PROGRAM

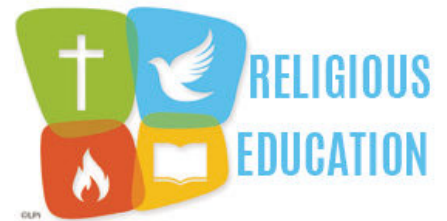
