

A NOTE FROM FR. O'DELL

BAPTISM OF THE LORD

In the New Testament, we hear the word Baptism for the first time. Initially, the word baptism applied to the ritual washing that John the Baptist was performing as he travelled about preaching to the people, preparing them for the coming of the Lord. In his baptism, he would invite people to bathe in the waters of the river Jordan, showing their repentance to God for their sins. His baptism did not carry with it forgiveness, but expressed a sense of conversion that the people were willing to undergo to align themselves with the Will of God in their lives.

The second mention of baptism comes when Jesus arrives at the Jordan and asks John to wash Him in the river. John initially refuses, telling Christ that He did not need to be washed clean (He was already totally clean). Christ tells Him to perform the baptism nonetheless, to fulfill all that had been prophesied. In other words, by going down into the waters of the river Jordan, Christ created the sacrament that you and I now know as Baptism. When He went down into the Jordan the heavens were torn open, and the voice of God the Father stated: "You are my beloved Son, in You I am well pleased." Immediately following that, the Holy Spirit descended upon Christ in the form of a dove. Here you have Father, Son and Holy Spirit, the Holy Trinity clearly signifying that something very important had just happened.

Later in the Gospels, just before He ascended back to Heaven, the third mention of Baptism occurs. Christ gave his Apostles the "Great Commission." He told them that they were to go forth and BAPTIZE all the nations, in the Name of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Christ was giving all humankind this sacrament of Baptism so that they could again share in God's grace and His salvation. Baptism was/is a big deal. I suggest that today would be a good time to go over the importance of Baptism in the lives of all people – and what it does to you when you receive it.

As you remember, Adam and Eve committed the Original Sin when they refused to obey God's command to not eat from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. Satan tempted both Adam and Eve and they gave in and ate from the tree. At the very second that sin was committed, grace left Adam and Eve's souls. They were immediately subject to the human condition (they would die, they would suffer the pangs of childbirth, they would labor always for whatever they had, they would be subject to getting sick, etc.). As a result, Adam and Eve were cast out of Paradise, with a promise that God would someday send them a Savior. As a result of this sin, every person born into this world (except Christ and the Blessed Virgin) would carry the stain of Original Sin on their souls. Baptism was needed to wash away that stain.

So the Sacrament of Baptism does the following four things for us. Baptism forgives Original Sin and all sin we may have committed prior to receiving the Sacrament. Baptism restores Sanctifying Grace to our souls (the grace we need to get into Heaven). Baptism makes us part of the Body of Christ (the Church). In Baptism, the Holy Spirit comes and "in-dwells" in the person receiving the Sacrament. We become Temples of the Holy Spirit.

When we receive Baptism, our souls are indelibly marked and conformed to Jesus Christ. This can never be taken back and Baptism can never be repeated. Baptism is the first of the three Sacraments of Initiation. The Baptismal font is often placed near the doorway of the church as Baptism itself is the spiritual doorway to the Church. The Bishop, Priest or Deacon are the usual and ordinary ministers of Baptism but in case of emergency, anyone may administer the Sacrament, as long as they do what the Church intends. The Sacrament is conferred by the pouring of clean/pure water over the head of the person, and the recitation of these words: "I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, Amen."
