

## **MESSAGES FROM FATHER COON**

- For Catholics, Christmas is celebrated as a Season and not just for a day. This beautiful Season ends Sunday January 9 with our celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. All are encouraged to keep decorations, at least their nativity scenes, displayed until then.
- January 1 is the annual Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. When it falls on a Saturday, as it does this coming week, it is not a Holy Day of Obligation because in many parts of our country priests cannot get to their multiple parishes that day and then get back to them for the Sunday Masses due to distance. However, all are encouraged to celebrate Mass on this special Solemnity. Our Mass will be at 8:00 a.m. with the Rosary prayed at 7:35.
- NEXT SUNDAY JANUARY 2ND, we will have our parish Epiphany celebration beginning at 11:45 in the Parish Hall. We will have a potluck meal followed by Catholic Jeopardy. If you cannot stay for Jeopardy, you can certainly move on to your next activity after eating. After Jeopardy, you are welcome to stay in the Hall to visit or to play cards and board games that you bring. Let us celebrate our Lord's birth together beyond the altar with fellowship, food, and fun at this special gathering. The parish will supply the meat and drinks. Those whose last names begin with A-H bring dessert; with J-P bring salad; with R-Y bring vegetable.
- A PERSONAL NOTE FROM FR. I know that there are those in our parish family who are experiencing your first Christmas without a loved one because since last year that loved one has died. Please be assured of my prayers for you these days that you experience the comfort and consolation that only the God of Life can give. May this Advent and Christmas Season renew your hope in the eternal life of Heaven that Jesus was born to bring.
- NEW MASS AND ADORATION TIME On Wednesdays, Mass will now be at 12:00 noon. Eucharistic Adoration will be from 1:00 to 7:00. Confession will be from 6:00 to 6:30. If you would like Eucharistic Adoration to be extended later than 7:00 so that you could more easily come, please let Fr. Coon know by calling him in the Parish Office at 624-7333.
- CALLING ALL WHO HAVE MADE CURSILLO RECENTLY OR IN THE PAST Fr. would like to gather with all those who have made Cursillo to see if there is interest in coming together perhaps once or twice a month for the Group Reunion portion of our Fourth Day. Fr. is excited about this opportunity. Our meeting to discuss this possibility will be Monday January 17 at 6:30 in the St. Margaret Mary Alacoque Room.
- A sincere word of thanks to those who have volunteered to lead the Rosary before our weekend Masses. The response has been very good. Mary desires only to bring us closer to her Son, and praying her Rosary helps that to happen in a tremendous way. If you would still like to volunteer to lead before a particular Mass time, please call Karl in the Parish Office. Thank you.
- While all are certainly welcome to wear masks during Mass, please remove your mask just before you are presented with the Body of Christ at Holy Communion. This will make for a reverent reception of our Lord and will diminish the possibility of dropping Him if you receive Him directly on your hand. Thank you.
- If you know of any parishioner who is homebound or in an area nursing home, please let Fr. Coon know by calling 624-7333 so that he can visit them on a regular basis.
- In order for people to make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament during the day, Fr. is keeping the single wooden door on the west side of the church unlocked during daylight hours.
- As a reminder, Fr. doesn't recognize people well, so please tell him your name when starting a conversation with him. He doesn't want to appear cold and unfriendly by not calling you by name.


