OUR TRUE HOME: SCOTT HAHN REFLECTS ON THE FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY

Why did Jesus choose to become a baby born of a mother and father and to spend all but His last years living in an ordinary human family? In part, to reveal God's plan to make all people live as one "holy family" in His Church (see 2 Corinthians 6:16–18).

In the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, God reveals our true home. We're to live as His children, "chosen ones, holy and beloved," as the First Reading puts it.

The family advice we hear in today's readings—for mothers, fathers and children—is all solid and practical. Happy homes are the fruit of our faithfulness to the Lord, we sing in today's Psalm. But the Liturgy is inviting us to see more, to see how, through our family obligations and relationships, our families become heralds of the family of God that He wants to create on earth.

Jesus shows us this in today's Gospel. His obedience to His earthly parents flows directly from His obedience to the will of His heavenly Father. Joseph and Mary aren't identified by name, but three times are called His "parents" and are referred to separately as His "mother" and "father." The emphasis is all on their familial ties to Jesus. But

these ties are emphasized only so that Jesus, in the first words He speaks in Luke's Gospel, can point us beyond that earthly relationship to the Fatherhood of God.

In what Jesus calls "My Father's house," every family finds its true meaning and purpose (see Ephesians 3:15). The Temple we read about in the Gospel today is God's house, His dwelling (see Luke 19:46). But it's also an image of the family of God, the Church (see Ephesians 2:19–22; Hebrews 3:3–6; 10:21).

In our families we're to build up this household, this family, this living temple of God. Until He reveals His new dwelling among us, and says of every person: "I shall be his God and he will be My son" (see Revelation 21:3, 7).

## **END-OF-YEAR TAX BENEFITS**

There are many reasons to make charitable gifts this year, whether to support churches and nonprofits affected by the pandemic or to provide assistance after disasters. Luckily, new tax laws and strategies can help you maximize tax breaks for yourself and benefit charities. Here's what you need to know:

#### **NEW \$300 CHARITABLE DEDUCTION FOR NON-ITEMIZERS**

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, or CARES Act, created several incentives for people to help charities including a charitable deduction of up to \$300 for single filers and \$600.00 for married couples filing jointly in 2021 even if you don't itemize. The standard deduction for 2021 is now at \$12,550 for single filers and \$25,100 for married couples filing jointly.

This special CARES Act provision now gives a tax incentive to all taxpayers to give at least \$300 to charity during 2021. To qualify, the gift must be made in cash, check or electronically, and go directly to the church or charity.

The CARES Act also helps people who are in a financial position to make very large gifts. In 2021, you can deduct cash gifts of up to 100% of your adjusted gross income, rather than the usual 60% limit. To qualify for this higher limit, the gifts must go directly to the church/charity, rather than to a donor-advised fund or private foundation. This can help wealthy people reduce their taxable income significantly in 2021, and it may also help retirees who have money to give but bump up against the income limits for the deduction. This can help the older generation who have a lot of cash but don't have a lot of income coming in and are trying to help out the community in any way they can.

#### MAKE A TAX-FREE TRANSFER FROM YOUR IRA

People who are age  $70\frac{1}{2}$  and older can give up to \$100,000 per year tax-free from their IRA to charity, a procedure called a qualified charitable distribution or QCD. The gift counts as their required minimum distribution but isn't included in their adjusted gross income. (Even though the SECURE Act, another recent tax law, increased the age to start taking RMDs from  $70\frac{1}{2}$  to 72, you can still make a qualified charitable distribution any time after you turn age  $70\frac{1}{2}$ .)

This is a great strategy for people who have to take RMDs (required minimum distribution) and would like to donate to charity. They can help the charity and not have to pay taxes on the money they have to withdraw from their IRA. But because of the CARES Act, people are not required to take RMDs in 2021. However, you may still be able to benefit from making a QCD (qualified charitable distribution) this year. The tax-free transfer takes money out of your IRA, which can help reduce future RMDs.

To keep the money out of your AGI, it must be transferred directly from your IRA to the charity – you can't withdraw it first. Ask your IRA administrator about the procedure, and let the charity know the money is coming. You have to give this money directly to a charity; it can't go to a donor-advised fund.






