

## FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



Over the last couple of weeks we have begun once again to feel the full force of winter, as temperatures drop below zero and winds howl. The cold is an unforgiving assault on life and it is easy in our modern world to forget just how formidable a threat it poses to both humans and animals. I try to explain to my family who live in warmer climates that they simply cannot imagine what a prolonged experience of sub-zero temperatures is like, as basically your body responds to the cold like it knows it is dying and thus decides to direct blood flow away from extremities toward vital organs to keep them alive as long as possible. Thanks to all of our modern marvels of industry, none of us today can likely understand the way the cold impacted people a century ago or especially a millennium ago.

Naturally, as the cold sets into our land, the needs for those on the margins of our society become more acute. Recently, a gentleman in Buffalo who is quite poor and has no transportation to get to the store for his groceries or to visit his doctor approached me about seeing if we could organize some kind of transportation to him. I explained that due to the various liabilities that would arise for the parish if we were to arrange carpools for him, we simply could not do it. The inability to arrange a carpool as a parish is an unfortunate reality in our litigious age, but it nonetheless is the place we find ourselves in as a society today. Fortunately, however, due to our Do Unto Others collections, I explained to him that while we cannot organize a carpool for him, our parish would be able to pay for him to have an unlimited pass for the Trailblazer transport each month during the cold of winter.

As we take up our Do Unto Others collection this weekend, it's worth remembering that the dollars raised in this work of mercy do help real people with real needs. As snow falls and temperatures drop during these upcoming months, there will be real people—such as the man I described above—who are helped by the generosity of our parishioners. Thank you to all of you who support the Do Unto Others collection here at St. Francis Xavier; it is a real and tangible way in which we bring the love of Christ to people in our world.





## CATHOLIC Q & A



#### Baptismal Bibs

Question: At a recent Baptism, the priest put a bib on the baby. Why is this done?

Answer: When an adult is baptized, there is a part in the ceremony when the newly baptized is vested in a white garment. It is symbolic of the changes that baptism brings in the life of the baptized as they are freed from the bonds of sin and brought into the saving grace of Christ. Realities that are so profound are symbolically presented so that we might better grasp and understand them.

Infants are often dressed in a baptismal dress, which is the baptismal garment. In some places, the bib is used as a kind of baptismal garment. At the place in the ceremony where the investiture takes place, the bib is used. Some are poncho-like and fit over the baby's head. Others are simply placed on the baby's chest. If the baby is dressed in a white garment, nothing else is needed. The prayer says it all: "See in your white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity ... bring that dignity unstained into the everlasting life of heaven." In baptism, we are given our purpose and goal in life as believers and this is symbolized by the white garment.


