FROM FATHER'S DESK

Father Nathaniel Meyers



Today marks the start of a new year and, along with it, I am certain many resolutions for the upcoming year. The idea of making a resolution at the start of the year is an ancient one, perhaps dating all the way back to the Babylonians over 4,000 years ago. The Babylonians would either crown a new king or reaffirm their loyalty the reigning one as they celebrated a 12-day festival that involved promising to pay off their debts and return any items that they had borrowed. Thus, in its origins, we can see the New Year's resolution was ultimately about trying to make things right with others.

Many of the resolutions people make in our current context are often about self-improvement, such as reading a book each month or losing weight. However, in an age of such polarization and divisiveness as our own, perhaps 2023 is an opportune time for us to retrieve the origins of the New Year's resolution and focus our efforts this year on making things right. For some, this could mean paying down a debt owed to someone or perhaps it will involve returning favors to those who have helped us in the past. Each of us has been the beneficiary of another's kindness and so it only makes sense to use this upcoming year to extend gratitude to those who have helped us. At the same time, each of us has some kind of misgiving or strained relationship, so it similarly makes sense that we resolve to work on those items as well.

Now that we have moved into a new year, let us make this a time where we will truly be able to set things right and work with those around us to fulfill God's plan in our lives. The upcoming year has many possibilities for us, especially as we will be starting the implementation of the Synod in our Archdiocese with a plan for evangelization and renewal of the faith. As the new year begins, may the Holy Spirit and the Blessed Mother help us to take part in Christ's reconciling power.

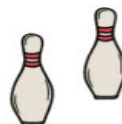
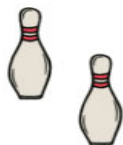

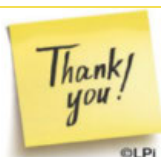

CATHOLIC Q & A: MARY, MOTHER OF GOD

Questions: If God is eternal and infinite, how can He have a mother? Why don't we call Mary just the mother of Jesus?



Answer: The title of "Mary, Mother of God" can be confusing. We aren't implying that Mary existed from eternity or that she is divine herself. We aren't promoting some kind of Marian superpowers. The Church has fought for this title throughout the centuries for one simple reason: Christ's identity is at stake.

As the Church grew, theologians wrestled with what it meant for Jesus to be both God and man. Many distortions of his identity began to emerge. One of these was propagated by Nestorius. Nestorius and his followers denied that Jesus' human nature and his divine nature were inseparable. Following that logic, Mary could have only conceived Jesus' human nature. But people don't give birth to a "nature." They give birth to a whole person. For Jesus, his whole person is both human and divine. In 431 A.D. the Council of Ephesus denounced Nestorius. The bishops affirmed that Jesus is both fully human and fully divine and proclaimed Mary *Theotokos*. Translating the Greek to English, that means "God-bearer." Note that this isn't "God-generator" or "God-creator." Mary bore Jesus, God and man, in her womb and gave him birth. She is mother to the whole person, the whole Jesus, and therefore Mother of God.

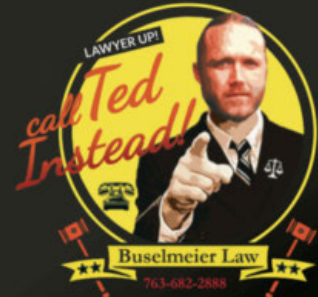
