CAPITAL CAMPAGIN FAQs

OPEN WIDE THE DOORS

Q: Where will the dollars come from to build the parish property?

A: Every parishioner of St. John Paul II Parish will be asked to participate financially in the *Open Wide the doors to Christ* capital campaign. Commitments and donations from our parishioners will be maintained by the parish office. Funds received for the capital campaign are restricted for that use only. The funds cannot be used for the general operations of the parish. So it is important to support the parish for both general operations and the capital campaign.

Q: What is needed for construction to being?

A: Permission from the Archdiocese will be needed prior to beginning construction. The Archdiocese looks to the parish to provide sufficient evidence that the parish can afford to pay for the construction and ongoing maintenance of the property. Two of the main criteria to begin building include having obtained 100% of the projected building cost committed by the parishioners of St. John Paul II Parish and at least 50% of the funds in our savings account.

The Stations of the Cross were delivered on Thursday, March 3 and installed on Friday, March 4...just in time for Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings. In case you missed this in a previous publication... The Stations of the Cross on a Journey

On Labor Day weekend of this past year, Sacred Heart Church in Atchison gifted us with many of their beloved possessions. The church was built in 1892 and after 130 years, it was consolidated with a nearby church. We obtained an altar, pews, candle sticks, votive candle stand, crosses, ambo, The Presider's Chair, large Pieta statue and Stations of the Cross.



We see all these beautiful items shape our church except for The Stations of the Cross. Where have they been hiding? The brackets and shelves outlining the outer aisles have been there since the beginning, but the shelves disappeared a few weeks ago. Have you ever experienced a project where Plan 1 would not cooperate? The Stations are that project.

All 14 Stations were carried downstairs in the church and carefully placed in a workroom for evaluation. Parishioners volunteered for months scraping and sanding blistered paint with most having six coats of paint over the century. Most have plaster cracks and others missing parts. One statue has a man whose left hand is a

wire form while others are missing fingers. With no light at the end of the tunnel, it was a unanimous decision to seek help due to the age of the statues and the fear of lead paint. A company was found in North Kansas City and willing to do all the statues and bases with a process called *encapsulation*. All the statues were packed and taken on the next adventure where the workers dress in protective gear and wear masks regulated by the EPA. Each statue is sanded by hand. Missing parts are made with a shaped silicone form filled with plaster, dried, and adhered to the statue. Next the statue is sprayed with four coats of white sealer while also checking for flaws between each coat. Drying time is a minimum of three days depending on the weather.

When you take the walk with Jesus as you pray each station, it is a walk that allows for reflection and reenactment of Jesus' final journey taken as He carried His cross to Golgotha. Our hope is that you will accompany Jesus on His final journey and share in His suffering while experiencing the dramatic and elegant Stations of the Cross. Even though Plan 1 did not work, Plan 2 is complete. Perhaps there will be a Plan 3 in the future. After all, these are The Stations of the Cross on a journey.
