4th Sunday of Lent

God asks a rhetorical and slightly sarcastic question to Samuel, the prophet: "How long will you grieve for Saul, whom I have rejected as king of Israel?" Like us, Samuel is depressed that the old king failed. It's painful to admit that the old regime is done. But God won't let us wallow our pity-party forever. "I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem," announces the Lord, "for I have chosen my king from among his sons." Samuel finally goes and anoints the young David as the new king. And his kingdom is glorious; it's the golden age of Israel's earthly history.

How discouraging to see that my own selfish ego is no longer in charge! How long will I grieve that money, power, pleasure, and reputation have been rejected as the ruler of my life? How wonderful that God has a new future in store for you and me. He is sending us to Bethlehem to anoint the new David as our king. His kingdom won't fail us. He'll slay our goliaths, unite our dispersed energies, and build a Temple where God himself will dwell.

Sitting before the Eucharist in awe and wonder is something faithful Catholics have been doing for centuries.

- 1. Unites you to the Sacrament of the Eucharist. "When you look at the crucifix, you understand how much Jesus loved you then. When you look at the Sacred Host, you understand how much Jesus loves you now." St. Mother Teresa
- 2. Increase in Holiness by Bathing in the Light of the Son. "Gaze upon him, consider him, contemplate him, as you desire to imitate him." St. Clare of Assisi
- **3.** Removes You from Temptations. Simply being before the Blessed Sacrament takes you away from worldly things.
- **4. Helps you to Examine your Conscience.** The longer you remain in the presence of God, the more you will reflect on your failings.
- **5. Provides a Reboot to your Spiritual Life.** We all need a reset; our lives get busy. Busy lives lead to tiredness, and tiredness causes us to give into temptation and sin.
- **6. Prepares You for Sunday Mass.** Praying before the Blessed Sacrament in adoration reminds you of the primary focus of the Mass.
- 7. Because the Church Recommends It. The 7<sup>th</sup> reason is simple the Catholic Church tells us to go. According to the Catechism, the Church and the world have great need of Eucharistic Adoration. Jesus waits for us in this sacrament of Love. Let us be generous in our time with Him. May our adoration never cease.


WE ARE IN NEED OF Communion ministers, lectors and ushers. Please become an essential minister of the Mass. Contact Loretta. Thank you.

# NOTES FOR ALL PARISHES


INFORMATION ABOUT THE LITTLE PORTION SECULAR FRANCISCAN FRATERNITY from Marshall. Minnesota:

Secular Franciscans are members of the Franciscan family who have the vocation to follow Christ by following the example of St. Francis of Assisi. St. Francis himself began this lay order over 800 years ago. At that time men were joining him in a holy life separate from the world, and those men later became the Order of Friars Minor (Fr. Pratap is a priest of the OFM). Women came to live a cloistered life with St. Clare of Assisi, and this order is now known as the Poor Clares. But laypersons who couldn't leave their families and stations in society also came to St. Francis and asked for a rule of life. And so, the Secular Franciscans (third Order) was born and continues to this day. You can go to: https://www.secularfranciscansusa.org to learn more about this particular path of faith for laypersons to "bring life to the gospel, and the gospel to life".
