PRAYER & WORSHIP

Weekly Words from The Rock:

I was hot!!!

Any week leading up to the deer hunting opener is filled with excitement and anticipation. First, there is the preparation. Do I have enough slugs? Is my slug gun properly sighted? Do I have all the clothes needed? Enough food? You get the point. Second, work must be completed. Even though it is difficult to concentrate the day's prior, there are still meetings, people to visit and homilies to prepare. I have been through enough deer hunts to know that as there is a beginning of the hunting season, every season also grinds to an end. With the conclusion of the season, work is awaiting. Before opening morning, I always had my homily prepared for opening weekend and the following weekend. And third, one dreams, dreams, and dreams some more. Is this the year I see a nice buck? Will I fill my tag? Will my brother fill his tag? When I hunted in Lewiston, I invited my brother to come out giving him a break from the farm hoping beyond hope that he would fill his tag.

One opening morning, I was sitting in my stand. When the "opening bell" kicked off, I couldn't believe all the shooting I was hearing up and down the valley. Granted the valley stretched for miles but the number of shots was staggering. About 45 minutes into the season, I looked and there were two deer standing twenty-five yards away. To this day, I don't know from where they had come. They just appeared. I sized them up and thought the one looked like a decent sized deer. I had two tags and could take either sex. It was my time to add to the "volley through the valley." I aimed and fired. My shot was true. I went over to look at my "trophy" and couldn't believe my eyes. I had shot a nub buck (a deer born that year which didn't have antlers large enough to protrude from its head). I was hot!! I said words that no priest should say. I couldn't believe I could have misjudged a deer's size so badly. I went back to my stand on three separate occasions only to walk over to take another look. The deer's size never changed. I never intended to tag a fawn, but because of my lack of discretion, I was left with no choice.

Have you ever had something like that happen? Maybe not deer hunting but where you misjudge things. That is the story of this week's gospel. In Luke 24:36b-37 we read, "He (Jesus) stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." But they were startled and terrified and thought they were seeing a ghost." A ghost? Speak about a massive misjudgment! Jesus takes great pains to prove he is not a ghost:

- A. He speaks a second time. Ghosts don't speak. In Luke 24:38 Jesus states, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts?"
- B. He tells them to touch him (verse 39). You can't touch a ghost.
- C. Shows them his hands and feet which still have the marking from the nails (verse 40).
- D. He eats (verse 43). A ghost does not eat. He takes a piece a baked fish and eats it in front of them.

All of this leads to the realization that before them is the risen Lord.

Don't be mislead! Our Lord, Jesus Christ is alive. He is risen. May these words be proclaimed to the ends of the earth. Amen! Alleluia!

It will place our attention on the role each of us is called to play in sharing the Gospel. Our theme comes from the Gospel of Matthew 5:13, "You are the salt of the earth." DECREE ON MASS STIPENDS

The Most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass recalls the Paschal Mystery and makes it new in every celebration. Celebrating the Eucharist is the highest form of liturgy celebrated by the Church. As such, it is effective for those who take part in the offering as well as for others who are not present at the Mass.

In particular, it is the immemorial custom of the Church to ask that priests apply the celebration of each Mass for a particular intention. Intentions may be persons who are living or deceased. Intentions may also be made for a particular cause, a group of people, or for a commemoration (e.g., a wedding anniversary). Specific details of private intentions should always be made known to the priest. Pastors are also expected to offer one Mass every Sunday and holy day of obligation for the people of the parish (canon 534).

The Christian faithful themselves are encouraged to make known to priests the intention for which they wish the priest to offer the Mass. In doing so, those who are able may contribute a stipend that would be attached to the particular intention. Priests are encouraged to review canons 945-958 to ensure Mass stipends are treated appropriately and fulfilled in a timely manner.

Jesus tell us in Matthew 10:10 that "the laborer deserves his keep." The church has interpreted this statement to refer to, among others, the priests of the Church. It is fitting, therefore, that a priest receives a stipend from the Christian faithful who are able to give it, not as a payment for a sacrament, but as part of his wage for the most important work that priests do: confect the Eucharist so that the people of God may benefit.

Therefore, I hereby decree that, in accord with the decision of the bishops of the province:

A Mass stipend to which an intention is attached is ten (10) dollars.

This decree is effective July 1, 2024

The 2024-2025 Compensation Policy for Priests will reflect this decree. Any intentions made prior to July 1, 2024 will be honored according to the number of Masses intended with the original offering. All Masses celebrated after July 1, 2024 will be afforded the stipend at the new rate.
