Weekly Words from The Rock:

This is My Commandment...

What is a command? It is an authoritative order. When a drill sergeant gives the order to salute, those in training salute. There were commands that we were asked to follow around the house while I was growing up. Here are a few:

- 1. Don't wear your shoes in the house.
- 2. If you want something at the kitchen table, the word "please" is required.
- 3. No jumping on the beds.
- 4. Don't sit in dad's chair in the living room.
- 5. Pick up after yourself.

There was one command I learned outside the confines of the house. Here is the story. Every Saturday, I helped my father clean the hog barns and grind feed. I had my own set of boots for such a purpose. One Saturday, I decided to be a little mischievous. As I was washing my boots with the hose, I took the hose and aimed it at my father pretending I was going to squirt him with water. His command was clear, "Don't you dare." Such a warning only egged me on thus I did it. I drenched my father. My father's response? I can't write it in this column, use your imagination. Suffice it to say that I never did it again. The commandment was given: "Don't squirt dad with the water hose." We all have similar stories and examples.

Jesus in today's gospel asks us to follow one command, referred to as a commandment. We read in John 15:12, "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you." Pause and think for a moment of what is entailed in this commandment.

- A. Love is to know no bounds. We are to love "one another." This includes everyone friends, neighbors, family, and enemies.
- B. Love means we love as Jesus loved. Think for a moment about Jesus' love. He loved everyone <u>and</u> his love was sacrificial in nature. When the one sheep was lost, Jesus went in search. When people mocked and jeered at him from the cross, he returned no insult rather forgave. Ultimately, his love went to the point of a willingness to die for friend and foe alike. This is what makes the love of Jesus Christ the most intimate type of love ever known. The man without sin died for everyone who knew and experienced sin. Are we willing to die for those who hate us, persecute us, despise us? Jesus Christ did, and his command is clear "love as I love."
- C. Love has at its source the love of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In my twenty eight years as a priest, I have learned that it is one thing to say I will love yet another to actually love. For love to happen, I need to pray. To be grounded in prayer helps one to know that one is loved and when loved, one can love. Ever tried to love when you are full of bitterness and anger? It doesn't work. Pray and allow the voice of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit to penetrate your heart and help you to know how much you are loved.

There you have it, the key to love. So let us truly love – friend, neighbor, family, and enemy. One more free piece of advice. Never, ever squirt your father with a water hose! You will save yourself a lot of pain and agony.



DECREE ON MASS STIPENDS

The Most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass recalls the Paschal Mystery and makes it new in every celebration. Celebrating the Eucharist is the highest form of liturgy celebrated by the Church. As such, it is effective for those who take part in the offering as well as for others who are not present at the Mass.

In particular, it is the immemorial custom of the Church to ask that priests apply the celebration of each Mass for a particular intention. Intentions may be persons who are living or deceased. Intentions may also be made for a particular cause, a group of people, or for a commemoration (e.g., a wedding anniversary). Specific details of private intentions should always be made known to the priest. Pastors are also expected to offer one Mass every Sunday and holy day of obligation for the people of the parish (canon 534).

The Christian faithful themselves are encouraged to make known to priests the intention for which they wish the priest to offer the Mass. In doing so, those who are able may contribute a stipend that would be attached to the particular intention. Priests are encouraged to review canons 945-958 to ensure Mass stipends are treated appropriately and fulfilled in a timely manner.

Jesus tell us in Matthew 10:10 that "the laborer deserves his keep." The church has interpreted this statement to refer to, among others, the priests of the Church. It is fitting, therefore, that a priest receives a stipend from the Christian faithful who are able to give it, not as a payment for a sacrament, but as part of his wage for the most important work that priests do: confect the Eucharist so that the people of God may benefit.

Therefore, I herby decree that, in accord with the decision of the bishops of the province:

A Mass stipend to which an intention is attached is ten (10) dollars.

This decree is effective July 1, 2024

The 2024-2025 Compensation Policy for Priests will reflect this decree. Any intentions made prior to July 1, 2024 will be honored according to the number of Masses intended with the original offering. All Mases celebrated after July 1, 2024 will be afforded the stipend at the new rate.
