Weekly Words from The Rock:

Questions

One of the focuses of the month of November is end-times. Speaking of questions regarding end-times, I am going to share with you some questions and answers from the book *Did Adam and Eve Have Belly Buttons and 199 other questions from Catholic Teenagers.*

Question 102 (page 136): How good do you have to be to go to heaven?

Answer: You cannot be good enough on your own to deserve to go to heaven (Romans 3:23). The Bible and the Catholic Church teach that a person cannot, strictly speaking, *earn* his or her way into heaven (Romans 3:20). Salvation is the free gift of God through Jesus Christ (Ephesians 2:8-9). But we must accept and freely cooperate with this gift (Galatian 5:6). God's grace can transform us so we can live holy lives and receive heaven as the "reward" for our faithfulness to Him (2 Corinthians 5:17). Salvation means being in proper relationship with God – believing, trusting, and loving God, giving ourselves to Him wholly and freely. Baptism puts us in that relationship by communicating to us the forgiveness of Christ and the grace of being a son or daughter of God (John 3:5). However, just because we have been baptized does not guarantee we will go to heaven. We can alienate ourselves from God if we willingly disobey God's law and turn our backs on Him through mortal sin. Even so, God is always willing to forgive us, especially through the sacrament of reconciliation where Christ cleanses us from our sins and reconciles us to Himself.

Question 103 (page 137): Should we do good things to be saved or because we are saved?

Answer: First, let us be clear on how we are saved. We are saved by grace through faith in Christ (Ephesians 2:8-9), not by our own efforts. In this sense, works *can't* save us. But we must cooperate with grace; faith must be completed by our love and obedience in order to be living, saving faith. Here, works or Christian obedience, motivated by the love of God and neighbor, come into play. Without such works, our faith is dead and cannot save us. So our cooperation – our "work" in a very limited sense – is necessary for salvation. Yet even our cooperation is a matter of grace. As St. Paul wrote, "Work out your salvation with fear and trembling, for God is at work in you, both to will and to work for His good pleasure (Philippians 2:12-13). Even when we cooperate with God by doing good, it is God who is inspiring, enabling, and moving us to do so. Our part is to say "yes" and to love God with our whole heart, mind, and strength by active obedience. One thing to keep in mind: Being saved is more than a "one-time event." It is a process. There are "three tenses" to salvation. If someone asks, "Are you saved?" you should answer: "I have been saved from my sins through Christ's death and resurrection. I am being saved as I cooperate with God's grace. And I will be saved so long as I do not reject God's love and I die in His friendship (that is, in a state of grace)." Salvation is a past, present, and future reality.

Question 109 (pages 142-143): Why are people afraid of death?

Answer: There are probably several reasons. Some people have difficulty believing that if they love God and serve Him on earth He will embrace them at the time of death. Also, there is a natural fear of the unknown, even if you have faith. In addition, almost every death scene we see in the movies and on television is not a pleasant experience. If we were to continually see the joyful faces of the canonized saints at the time of their death, our fear of death would greatly decrease, if not disappear. It would be a good practice to meditate on the joy of seeing God at the time of our death. Scripture says, "For as a man [thinks]...so is he" (Proverbs 23:7). If we think and pray about what a joyful experience heaven will be, God will give us the grace to firmly believe it. One should also develop a devotion to St. Joseph, who is the patron of a happy death.

Question 114 (pages 146-147): Are there different levels of heaven?

Answer: The Catholic Church teaches there are different levels of joy in heaven because there are different levels of reward (Matthew 20:21). This difference, though, does not cause any jealousy or distance between the saints, because all are perfected in charity and perfectly happy in the presence of God. Here is a frequently used analogy: Imagine your soul is like a glass. In heaven, some people will have a large "glass"; others will have a small "glass." Those with large glasses can have more of God's love poured into them (that is, poured into their soul) because they loved more perfectly on earth. They prepared their soul to receive more of God. The person with a smaller "glass" can hold less of God's love but will still be completely filled with Him. Yet, he or she will want for nothing and will not be jealous of those who receive more of God's love.


OFFICE CLOSED: The office will be closed from December 25th through January 5th. Please get all end of year contributions to the office by December 23rd. Thank you.
