

PRAYER & WORSHIP

Weekly Words from The Rock:

Third Day

If I were to ask, what is the most familiar link to the "third day" in the pages of the Bible, what would be people's response? It is a common phrase. Here are some examples:

- 1. Genesis 1:12 On the third day, the land bears plants and trees which produce fruit.
- 2. Genesis 22:1-12 On the third day, Isaac is spared being sacrificed and in his place a ram is offered as a burnt offering.
- 3. Genesis 19:11 On the third day, Moses tells the people to be ready for the Lord will come down on Mount Siani for all to see.
- 4. Esther 5:1 On the third day, Esther enters the presence of the king for the purpose of saving the Israelite people.
- 5. Hosea 6:2 Hosea's expectation is the Lord raising the people after they have been torn and struck down.

Most people's response to the question I posed would be on the third day Jesus Christ rose from the dead. I wouldn't put up an argument. This weekend is the story of the Wedding Feast at Cana. How does the story begin? John 2:1 states, "On the **third day** there was a wedding in Galilee and the mother of Jesus was there." There it is again, the "third day." And with the phrase, we launch into the first miracle of Jesus Christ. Over my almost thirty years as a priest, I have officiated at many weddings. I like to remind couples your most important goal in life is to get your spouse to heaven. Fail at that and you have failed at your most important work.

What strikes me about the Wedding Feast miracle is the words of Mary. She makes two statements. Let us look at each.

A. In John 2:3, Mary makes the most obvious of remarks, "They have no wine." Her words are meant to illicit a response. Jesus, do something about this. It is difficult for a son to refuse the request of his mother. Even while saying in John 2:4, "Woman (meaning his mother), how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come.", Jesus' intention is to set to work.

B. In John 2:6, we have the final recorded words of Mary in the Bible. They read, "Do whatever he, Jesus, tells you." Jesus tells the servers to fill the six jars with water and the rest is history. The water is changed into wine.

Sticking with the words of Mary, what does Jesus tell us? Ask a group of young children and they would list the following:

- **1.** Obey your parents.
- **2.** Don't fight.
- **3.** Share what you have.
- 4. Be fair.
- As adults, we would add:
- 1. Learn how to love as Jesus loved sacrificially not selfishly.
- 2. Seek the good of the other without counting the cost.
- **3.** Forgive, with no exceptions.
- **4.** Learn to be just.
- **5.** Keep in mind the poor.
- These are only a few. Others could be added. As a priest, I have learned:
- $\ensuremath{\textbf{a.}}$ Serve your people. Don't expect them to serve you.
- **b.** Treat everyone with dignity and respect.
- C. Ask forgiveness when you hurt someone.

And that is where Jesus leaves us this week. In every situation we encounter during the week ahead ask, "What is Jesus telling me." He is speaking. What we need to do is listen. Pray that we be faithful in the task.






