I don't watch a great deal of television; however, on Sunday, June 15th I sat down and watched the last holes being played at the U.S. Open. The world's greatest golfers were trying their hand at winning one of golf's majors. Betting odds had names like:

None of these names were in serious contention on Sunday afternoon at Oakmont Country Club. The winner was someone no one had picked. His name was J.J. Spaun. To clinch the tournament, his final putt on the 18th hole is nothing short of amazing.

What I learned from the U.S. Open was the greatest golfers in the world don't always have the final say. This weekend's gospel is about the "greatest." A scholar of the law asks Jesus, "What must I do to inherit enteral life?" The response from Jesus, "Love God with all your mind, heart, soul and strength and your neighbor as yourself." Down through the centuries, this has come to be known as the "Greatest Commandment."

With many things, the "greatest" can be debated. This would include a list of golfers. When it comes to the commandments, things are different. There is only one. And to further justify that love, the gospel defines "neighbor" in the Parable of the Good Samaritan. Love is to extend to everyone - even our most bitter rival, the person we can't stand, the one who constantly mocks us.

So let us love and pray to our Lord that we remain in his love.

SEMINARY EDUCATION FUND: When Bishop Barron joined the Diocese of Winona-Rochester in 2022, he challenged the people of the diocese to grow our number of seminarians from 20 to 40. Today we have 25 Seminarians who will be continuing their formation in the fall. That's some great progress in just 3 years!

But more progress is needed. Our diocese has 67 priests who are actively ministering. After accounting for those who retire when eligible and others who could be recalled to their own dioceses, we'd be down to just 41 priests serving our diocese's 90 parishes, a seminar, high school, college chaplaincies, Mayo Clinic and Chancery (diocesan leadership) roles! Can you believe that?

A second collection will be taken on July 26th-27th to help replenish the Seminary Education Fund. Please give to this important cause, our diocese's future priests.


Reconciliation continues to be available. All are encouraged to continue coming to confession throughout the year; or return to the sacrament of reconciliation.

EUCHARISTIC RIVIAL: THE YEAR OF MISSION WE WALKED WITH JESUS. NOW WE RUN. The Eucharistic Heart of Jesus has been working and drawing all people to Himself: Can you feel it?

For six weeks, ending on Corpus Christi Sunday, 8 pilgrims walked (and drove) across 10 states and 24 (arch) dioceses and (arch)eparchies. Mile by mile, city by city, thousands of souls encountered the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus. And along the way, the ordinary became extraordinary. Streets became sanctuaries. Strangers became family. Music became prayer. Hearts opened wide. Our Precious Lord was adored.

The St. Katharine Drexel Route was never just about a destination: this pilgrimage was about transformation and encounter. From small towns in the Midwest to major cities like Dallas and Los Angeles, we witnessed the Church ALIVE and a people showing up in large numbers out of their love for God. They used the word 'revival' not in a past-tense way to describe an initiative, but rather, to somehow articulate the burning in their hearts for more ways to encounter Jesus. This revival is a fire. And it's spreading.

It's difficult to summarize the Eucharistic amazement that took place. Children knelt in adoration along the roads and in their schools. Confessions were heard as the faithful walked in Eucharistic processions. Many wept tears of joy and the music felt like a foretaste of praising the Lord in Heaven. At some points along the way, the journey felt like "the Way of the Cross." Even when we prayed in places stricken with devastation from the recent wildfires, or when our closing procession in Los Angeles had to be modified for safety, this pilgrimage became a way to see how the Lord calls us to something deeper. That revival doesn't avoid suffering, but surrenders everything to the Lord's will, trusting that we will have the grace to pass through.

Corpus Christi Sunday does not mark the end of the revival. It is only one moment in the divine work of the Eucharistic Lord to transform hearts across our country.

We are frequently asked: What is next for the National Eucharistic Congress after the pilgrimage? And the answer is simple:

We walked with Jesus. Now we run.

Filled with hope, we run with an urgent and renewed call to mission. The Church needs witnesses on fire: and <u>we NEED YOU.</u> Your personal love for Jesus in the Eucharist is meant to light up your home, your parish, your community.

We invite you to become a Eucharistic Missionary: someone who doesn't just receive the fire of revival, but carries it forward. The Revival lives on in every act of faith, every hour of Eucharistic adoration, and every invitation you extend to someone longing for more.

Because hope has a name. And we carried Him.

And now, so will you.
