ABOUT OUR CENTER

BUTLER COUNTY TRANSIT VAN: Operates every day the Center is open. The van provides public transportation for all ages .The van travels to Lincoln, Omaha, Columbus and surrounding towns. Call for special rate days. Please call 402-367-6131 at least 48 hours in advanced to make an appointment.

BUSY WHEELS: This is public transportation for in town trips. This services is provided by our great volunteers. Hours are 8:30-2:30 on the days the Center is open. It is preferred to have appointments made a day in advanced. This is a curb to curb service.

CONGREGATE MEALS: We serve Congregate meals at the Center each day the Center is open. We ask that you call to make a reservation by 9:00am on the day you would like a meal. Meals will be served at 12:00pm each day. The suggested cost for those over 60 is \$4.00 and the cost for those under 60 is \$5.00. All take out meals will now be \$5.25.

HOME DELIVERED MEALS: We also offer Home Delivered meals to those that are physically unable to come to the Center to eat a meal. The suggested cost of the meals are \$4.25 for those over 60 and \$5.25 for those under 60. For more information regarding this service we ask that you call 402-367-6131 for more information.

Save money by buying larger quantities of foods that store well like whole grains, canned or dried beans, and frozen vegetables. Don't overbuy foods that you will throw out later.



Look for on-sale produce

Grocery stores rotate their sales and buying what is on sale is a great way to save money and get variety. Do the same with frozen and canned items.



2 C CHOPPED CUCUMBERS 1 MEDIUM YELLOW PEPPER 1 MEDIUM ORANGE PEP-PER BOTH CHOPPED 1 C CHOPPED TOMATOES 1/4 RED ONION DICED

GARLIC DRESSING

2-3 MINCED CLOVES OF GARLIC JUICE FROM 1 MEDIUM LEMON 1 TBS EXTRA VIRGIN OLIVE OIL 1 HEAPING TBS DIJON MUSTARD 1-2 TBS WATER SALT & PEPPER TO TASTE IN A SMALL BOWL COMBINE THE DRESSING INGREDI-ENTS AND THEN SET TO THE SIDE. THEN USING A LARGE BOWL PUT ALL THE SALAD INGREDIENTS. COAT ALL OF THE VEGETABLES WITH THE DRESSING AND CHILL FOR A FEW HOURS BEFORE EATING. THE SALAD CAN BE ENJOYED AS IT IS OR EVEN SERVED OVER A BED OF LETTUCE. YOU COULD ALSO ADD SOME CANNED CHICKEN OR TUNA FOR A COMPLETE MEAL. THIS WILL MAKE 3-4 SERVINGS. STORE IN AN AIRTIGHT CONTAINER FOR 5-6 DAYS.
