Much of what we know about Jesus' early life arises in the context of journeys. Mary agrees to be Jesus' mother and then "in haste" travels to see her relative Elizabeth. After three months Mary returns home to Nazareth and next, she and Joseph travel to Bethlehem for the census.

After Jesus' birth, shepherds travel to see Him and He is visited by the Magi, who have come a great distance from the East. Mary and Joseph travel to Jerusalem to present Jesus to the Lord about 40 days after He is born.

In Matthew's Gospel we read about the threat to Jesus'life, which causes Mary, Joseph, and Jesus to journey to Egypt, where they stay until Herod dies and they return to Nazareth. Finally, there is the trip to Jerusalem when Jesus is 12 and, without telling His parents, He stays behind teaching in the Temple, causing them to search frantically for Him for three days.

We're used to travel these days, and we can forget what a difficult and risky thing travel was 2,000 years ago. Mary's trip to see Elizabeth covered more than 100 miles, through rough country, on poor or non-existent roads, with the constant threat of robbers. Scripture tells us she travelled alone.

The trip Mary and Joseph made from Nazareth to Bethlehem was about 90 miles, and Mary made the trip while very pregnant. When Joseph was told by an angel to flee to Egypt, he and Mary left everything behind and travelled close to 400 miles.

None of these trips was a vacation, and they weren't made for fun. They were made either because of a government mandate or threat, or to honor God's will.


Yet despite the fact that the trips were difficult and dangerous, and were undertaken for reasons not of their choosing, it seems that Mary and Joseph never complained. They did what was required, trusting God to have their backs.

As we look to the New Year ahead, we can expect that we too will have journeys to make, literally and metaphorically. They might be difficult and may involve things we do not prefer. We will be tempted to complain and object or to find reasons not to do what we are being asked to do.

When that happens, we might remember the example of Mary and Joseph and try to emulate their faith. If we truly believe we are travelling the paths that God wants us to travel, we can tolerate the difficulties that arise and willingly take the risks that are required.

Of course, that level of connection with God doesn't just happen. It is the result of regular and conscious effort involving time spent in prayer, quiet, contemplation and the sacraments. Those are the things that prepare our spirits to undertake the journeys that God puts before us.

May God go with you in all your journeys in 2022.



Children, Preschool - 5th grade, will begin Mass with their parents in the pews and after the opening prayers. Fr. Kuss will call the children to the front of the church for a blessing and the children will leave the nave with Cinthia Biros and Michelle Biros. In the Celtic Center the children will hear a reading and the Gospel and then discuss those readings, say the Creed and finish with Prayers of the Faithful. The children will return to their

pews as the altar is being prepared for Liturgy of the Eucharist.

This Week at Confirmation: Though we are taking a couple of weeks off from Confirmation prep, we closed out 2021 strong with our first Annual Quest Retreat for our 8th grade Confirmation Students. As part of the retreat, we played games, spent a beautiful hour in adoration, prayed a group rosary, offered reconciliation, had our guys and girls group conversations, and closed the retreat attending the Saturday evening, Vigil Mass. It was a great weekend and we saw Jesus move in the lives of our students!

This school year, we have the children meeting in person on Wednesday evenings so that we can come together as a community and learn more about how to follow Jesus Christ's teachings. It has been fun getting to be with, and coming to know, the children of our parish's community. I am excited to begin the New Year teaching the children. Here are the upcoming activities:

Kindergarten - 7th Grade = We have Homeward Bound Theatre Company coming on Wednesday, January 5th for two performances of teaching the children in Kindergarten - 7th Grade the Archdiocesan Mandatory Personal Safety Lessons. We will continue with our weekly lessons at home and classroom sessions every Wednesday evening through early May.

2nd Graders = Will begin their journey to the Sacraments of First Reconciliation (March 5th) and First Eucharist (May 1st). More information to follow the first few weeks of January.

CGS - We will continue to serve 3- and 4-year-old children in our Atrium for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. Any child who will begin Kindergarten in the fall of 2022, we will have their Faith Formation teachings in the Atrium. If you have a 3- or 4year-old and would like to give him/her a head-start in the Atrium, please give us a call to get him/her started. In the Atrium, there are no hard start and stop dates as the children learn independently of each other.

RCIA - We have two adults and three older children who are in our Rite of Christian Initiation program preparing for the Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Eucharist, and Confirmation at our Easter Vigil Mass on Saturday, April 16th, 2022.

CLOTW - We hope to continue this ministry in the new year. We are looking for adult volunteers to serve at Mass once a month. Please give us a call if you would like more information on how you can serve our children at 10:00 AM Mass on Sundays.

Totus Tuus - This is a summer Faith Formation Program run by the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis for children in Kindergarten - 12th Grade. We will be hosting this summer fun program the week of July 10th - July 15th, 2022. Mark your calendars to SAVE THE DATES.






