

FROM THE DEACON



We have finished Advent and the Christmas Season, and are into what the Church calls "Ordinary Time." If you check the cover of your bulletin, you'll see this is the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time. So, when was the First Sunday of Ordinary Time, you mightask? It wasn't last Sunday as that was the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This is actually a trick question.

First, we need a little background on the Church calendar. Broadly speaking, the Church's calendar is divided into categories: Ordinary Time, Advent and the Christmas Season, which goes from Christmas to the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, Easter - Lent and the Easter Season, which goes from Easter to Pentecost Sunday.


The rest of the year is "Ordinary Time." Not because the time is "commonplace or without any special features," which is the usual meaning of the word "ordinary," but because the time is denominated using "ordinal" numbers, which are numbers that designate a place in an order, like first, second and third. Depending on when Advent starts, there are 33 or 34 weeks of ordinary time in a year.

Ok, so back to my trick question: when is the First Sunday of Ordinary Time? The answer is: never. Because the Christmas Season ends on the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord, which is a Sunday, the first day of Ordinary Time is a Monday and that first week of Ordinary Time doesn't have a Sunday in it. The first time we get to a Sunday is the beginning of the second week of Ordinary Time, which is why that Sunday is called the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time. Make sense? Perhaps. Maybe none of this matters except if you're playing a Catholic trivia game.

It is worth pausing and realizing that "ordinary time" is the bulk of the year, in and out of the Church. We have Christmas and Easter, and big personal celebrations like birthdays and weddings, but most of our time is spent in the simple day-to-day existence of family, work, and friends. It is basic blocking and tackling. It is "ordinary," in the commonplace sense of the word.

But it is in the "ordinary" that we are called to grow in holiness, responding to grace to become saints. It is in the "ordinary" that we live out our basic Christian faith. It is in the "ordinary" that we love God and love our neighbor, helping, encouraging, caring for and holding up those whose paths cross ours, and offering simple prayers of thanks or joy or supplication to God along the way. The "ordinary" is where holiness happens.

CELEBRATING CHILDREN AT ST. PATRICK CATHOLIC CHURCH


- Relax, God put the wiggle in children; don't feel you have to suppress it in God's house.




