It's that time of year again where many of us make our annual New Year's resolutions. We all love resolutions because no matter where we are in our lives, there is always room for improvement. And, of course, one area we can always improve is our spiritual lives. The most important goal any of us can make for ourselves for the coming year is to strive to be more like Christ. So, here are a few suggestions to help us achieve that goal in 2022.

Evangelization can't happen without each of us committed to understanding and spreading our faith. So maybe this year we commit to catechizing ourselves so we're able to explain and defend our Catholic faith. The best place to begin is with God's Word, the Bible. By reading scripture daily, we will let Him renew our minds and guide us. The daily scripture readings are posted in the bulletin every week. There are also plenty of programs out there for us to join with others to learn more about our faith like the Emmaus Initiative, The Great Adventure Bible Timeline with Jeff Cavins, The Bible in a Year podcast with Fr. Mike Schmitz, just to name a few.

We all want our churches to be viable, and that takes commitment. Becoming involved with a ministry can help build relationships and make our parish communities feel more like family. So, this year we might resolve to seek out and join a parish ministry or group: becoming a lector, Eucharistic Minister, greeter, or usher; joining the choir; becoming active in the Altar and Rosary Society or Knights of Columbus; or volunteering to clean the church, set up for Mass, or help with religious education.

We can make a commitment to listen more and talk

less. When we're with family, friends, or neighbors, we can allow them to talk, without offering our opinion, just listening. Disciplining ourselves to listen to other people can ultimately lead us to listen to God's voice instead of constantly talking to Him, allowing Him to speak to our hearts and responding to Him with love.

Perhaps now we go to confession twice a year: during Lent and during Advent. (Mostly because the church's Code of Canon Law tells us we must at least once a year.) But this year our goal might be to go to confession once a month. It's never easy to face our sins and say them out loud, but receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation frequently gives us the grace to fight those sins, following the commandments and the teachings of the Church.

Finally, we might resolve to end every day by doing a good examination of conscience, which involves reflecting on our thoughts, words, and deeds in order to identify any sins. We often do an examination of conscience before we go to confession, but what if we resolved to do it every day? After all, it's not just a way to identify our faults, it's also a way to identify how we could do better tomorrow.

This weekend we celebrate the Epiphany. Just as the Magi searched for the child king upon His birth, an important part of our personal faith journey involves seeking and searching for God. The Magi saw something new and promising, and they were willing to go look for it, not simply to sit back and hope God would bring it to them. So just like the Magi, we need to move ourselves in a new direction by setting a goal to improve our spiritual lives in the new year.
