

God Given Gifts

To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. (Corinthians 12:7)

God gives gifts to every one of us. The first gift He gives us is the gift of our faith, the knowledge of His mercy and promise of eternal life. This is what draws us to Mass every week, to thank Him and glorify Him. But these aren't the gifts St. Paul is talking about in today's second reading, nor are they the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit. These are the gifts God gives to each of us to help build His Church here one earth.

God specially designs a gift for each of us. These "spiritual gifts" are not given to help us, they are given so that we might help others to build up the Church. We are meant to be part of a family, a community of people who will support, challenge, and encourage each other on our spiritual journeys. Each of us has something different to offer. God wants us to live in communion with others because we become better people when we learn to live with and love the people around us, sacrificing for our family and friends, which is why we're each given a special gift, and our spiritual abilities, given to us by God, are given to unite us, as one church family.

We may feel like our spiritual gift isn't as important as someone else's, but we're wrong. Every gift is vital. We need every single person doing his/her part if we are going to keep our parishes alive and viable to carry out God's mission here on earth. We need people to take on We need people to serve on leadership roles. committees and sit through meetings. We need people to be Eucharistic Ministers, lectors, greeters, and ushers. We need people to play instruments and sing. We need people to prepare the altar before the priest arrives. We need people to teach. We need people to keep the books and organize the day-to-day activities of the parishes. We need people to shovel the walks and make sure the furnaces work. We need people who are loud and outgoing, and we need people who are quiet and thoughtful. We need everyone!

So, we must pray for the discernment to recognize the gifts we've been given and then use them to serve God and others. In these days in which the Church seems to be weakening and losing vitality, God's power is needed desperately. We need to recognize and use our Godgiven spiritual gifts, because that is how we will make the Church, the body of Christ, stronger!




