

According to the annual diocesan "Mass counts" for 2021, there were just over 19,000 Catholics in our pews across the diocese. This is just over 60% of the 30,000+ people in our pews in 2019, pre-pandemic. If we take the number of people in our pews and multiply it by three (19,000 x 3), we get 58,000. Hence, the "58,000 Cups of Coffee Initiative," the next step in our journey to becoming a more synodal Church, walking together in faith into the future.

The idea behind the initiative is that all of us currently in the pews should strive to have a conversation with three different people: one who is already in our pews, one who used to be in our pews but hasn't been since the pandemic, and one who has either never been a part of a faith community or stopped practicing religion at some point. The question for these conversations is the same as the listening sessions we've already had -- As you think about your experience of the Catholic Church, what fills your heart and what breaks your heart?

These conversations should be informal and not forced, probably best one-on-one. One way to begin is by

explaining a little about the Synod and thanking them for sharing their experience with you. The simple goal of the conversations is to listen with genuine curiosity in order to understand their experience of the Catholic Church better, not in order to respond – no arguing or defending -- just deep and respectful listening. This is not the time for debate. It is a time to just humbly listen, allowing people to speak honestly.

The easiest conversation is probably the one with someone already in our pews. But at some point we need to branch out beyond the walls of the church, listening to those who used in be in our pews but haven't been since the pandemic, and those who have disaffiliated from the Church or who never practiced the faith. This is not the time to convince them to come to Mass, but simply to listen, to understand, and to get to know their experience of the Catholic Church better.

If that's uncomfortable, share your conversations with any member of the Evangelization team and he/she can report the results for you. Help the diocese reach the goal of 58,000!
