This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad. (Ps 118:1-2)

Today, Easter Sunday, is a wonderful day to spend celebrating God's love for us. Jesus Christ is risen from the dead! This is our Easter joy. Pope John Paul II once said, "We are an Easter people and Hallelujah is our song!" We need to go forth from Mass today with a song in our hearts, spreading joy, because joy is contagious.

Today God gives us the grace for us to encounter Him anew. If our hearts are open, we have the opportunity to encounter Him and have our hearts filled with joy. He wants to share that joy with us so that we, His children, may radiate that joy to our families, our friends, our community, our world.

In today's gospel, the first thing Mary Magdalene did when she saw the empty tomb was to excitedly run back and tell Peter and the other disciple the tomb was empty; Jesus wasn't in the tomb. She didn't walk, she ran! For her, Easter morning was a personal encounter with the risen Christ, and the first thing she did was share the good news with other people. That's what we need to do. We need to celebrate our belief in the risen Christ! Mary Magdalene was not the only one running on Easter morning. Peter and the other disciple ran as fast as they could to see the empty tomb, too. Even though the other disciple beat Peter to the tomb, he did not go in, but Peter did. He wasn't one bit afraid of facing the unknown, of facing death itself. His love for Jesus overruled all fear and uncertainty.

At one point in his life, out of fear, Peter denied Jesus three times, but that was in the past. Peter's love for Jesus conquered his fear. Easter morning was a new beginning for him, and it's a new beginning for us, too. The past is the past. Our sins have been forgiven by Jesus's death on the cross. We need to let go of our fear of death. After all, Jesus defeated death. He rose from the dead to eternal life, and we will too if we believe in him.

God loves us, forgives us, and journeys with us throughout our lives, and into eternal life as well. We have nothing to fear. So, let's share our Easter joy! Let's go out today and smile, be happy, look people in the eye, greet strangers, go out of our way to be nice to people, just enjoy being alive. That's the good news of Easter. That is our Easter joy!
