

Be Like The Apostles

For most of the liturgical year the readings follow a certain pattern: the first reading is from the Old Testament, the second reading is from the New Testament, and then the gospel. But during this Easter season, the Old Testament reading is replaced by the Acts of the Apostles, an important book because it is the story of the Church's beginnings and how evangelization played a role in the spread of faith around the world.

Looking at this section of the Bible is like looking at family history, Church family history. We can look at how we ought to follow Christ by looking at those who literally "followed" Christ. The Apostles had seen the resurrected Lord and were compelled to pass on his truths and promise of eternal life for those who believed. These truths and promises motivated them to follow Jesus faithfully, and they wanted nothing more than to tell everyone about the possibility of experiencing the power of Jesus in their lives -- the same power they themselves had experienced.

Even though the Apostles were committed to their message, they were still ill-prepared for the task of preaching the gospel and building the Church. They didn't have any catechism or papal encyclicals to guide

them. They had no church buildings, no retreat centers, and no canon law. All they had to draw on were their memories of Jesus and what they had experienced. But they placed their hope and trust in him, and he graced them with the gift of the Holy Spirit to strengthen them and guide them.

This is how the Church was born...and thrived! That should be a lesson for all of us. If we learn the words and works of Jesus, if we place our hope and trust in him, and if we ask the Holy Spirit for the grace to live as we are called to live, untold blessings will flow because everything is possible for those who believe in Jesus. And the Church will continue to grow...and thrive!

So, these next few weeks when we hear the readings from the Acts of the Apostles, we need to remind ourselves of the commitment of our Church ancestors. Like them we need to remember the Church isn't a building. Church isn't something we attend. Church is something of which we are part. And like those original Apostles, we need to be committed to passing on the truths and promises of Jesus Christ!


