

Follow Me

Jesus's original disciples literally followed him. They physically left jobs, families and homes to accompany him as he traveled around teaching and healing people. In today's world, Jesus is no longer here physically, so we cannot literally follow him in the same way those original disciples did. But we are still called to follow him as disciples.

That was Jesus's original command, "Follow me." He called the Apostles to leave everything behind and follow him. And they did! Then after three years, Jesus was going to leave them and he gave them a new command, "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:34-35) This, too, is our new command.

The command to love sounds wonderful so long as we can define what love means. All too often we try to define love on our own terms. When we do so, we tend to love those who are close to us like family and friends, or those who will appreciate our love and return it, or those whom we find it easy to love. In short, we like to choose the people we love rather than loving the people God places in our lives. But the love of Jesus teaches us a different standard.

Loving as Jesus loved is difficult and challenging. On Holy Thursday, Jesus washed the feet of the disciples to give them an example of how to love; his example of love was humble, sacrificial, self-giving for those who need it and not just for those who appreciate it. That's our example to follow as well. We should also remember who was at the meal with Jesus, Judas and Peter. Judas, who he knew full well was about to betray him and Peter, who he knew was about to deny him. But Jesus still loved them both.

In this line from today's gospel, Jesus tells us that only when we love as he loved can we be a disciple. That's important for us to take note. Jesus didn't say disciples are people who memorize religious teachings, observe religious rules, perform religious acts of personal piety, or go to church on Sunday. All those things are well and good because they give us grace and lead us closer to God, but according to Jesus, the singular identifying quality of a disciple is that we love as he loved, which means we live out the faith we profess in our sacrificial love for God and neighbor.

When we allow the love of God to flow through us into the world, then we are allowing others to know God through us. That's what it means to evangelize! As Catholics, this is a challenging message and one that should cause us to re-examine how effectively we have been such disciples!


