FROM FR. JOEL

Beginning 2022 - Resolving to give our lives to Jesus.

Today we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord; that is, the event when Jesus' presence as the newborn king was made known to the world through the visit of the magi. Like at Jesus' birth we are offered a time of renewed encounter with Jesus and His love for us on this day as He is revealed to the world. At the same time, as this day arrives on what is the second day of a new calendar year, we likewise have opportunity to give ourselves to Jesus in a renewed way – asking that the new year be a time of greater union with Him in our lives.

Two years ago on January 1, 2020, I remember proposing to those whom I served at the time the idea of a "2020 vision." Within this 2020 vision, I put forth that unity with Christ and awareness of His presence in all the aspects of our lives could be increased by very simple and definite ways of living our faith. In particular, I proposed five particular actions as ways to increase our relationship with Jesus: 1) an increase of devotion to the Holy Eucharist; 2) regular confession; 3) praying daily with the Sacred Scriptures; 4) willingly embracing regular acts of self-denial, such as fasting and/or abstaining from meat on every Friday of the year; and 5) greater devotion to the Virgin Mary, especially through praying the Rosary daily. Though it was soon after proposing this vision that all of us were thrown into the very difficult situation of the COVID-19 pandemic (as it was in March 2020 that lockdowns came and Masses were suspended), surely the Lord is providentially at work bringing about a greater good in all of this.



FROM FR. JOEL (CONTINUED)

I share with you my reflection on a 2020 vision for three purposes. First of all, as we continue to live in times of uncertainty, the five actions listed in this vision remain as firm of foundation as ever in allowing Jesus Christ to become ever more present in our lives. In fact, I say with conviction that the continued acceleration of events in the world has made these ways even more firm – for as life itself and its many circumstances continue to change (often becoming more difficult), the surety that comes to us through Jesus Christ, the sacraments, and the life of faith in Him all remain true. By faithfulness to these ways of living, we can be assured that Jesus Christ abides in us and sustains us, helping us in whatever way we need – minding that Jesus never promised this life to be an easy ride, but that he did promise that He is with us always to the end of the age no matter what may come in this life (see Matthew 28:20).

Second, since many are accustomed to making "New Year's resolutions," what more meaningful resolution can be made than to give ourselves more fully to Jesus Christ? Indeed, while each day can be a chance to renew our faith, making such an act in specific moments aids us in remaining true (just as any promise we have formally made helps us to stay committed).

Finally, and related to the second, making any resolution with others who are doing the same helps us stay firm in our resolve. Just as any successful team works together toward a common goal with each member being true to their own part, so too when we as faithful followers of Jesus have a common purpose and commit together to living our faith more firmly, we aid one another in staying true and share together the fruits of our commitment.

To that end, as we see Jesus revealed today, I encourage all to see this moment as opportunity to more firmly commit to Jesus in our lives by taking up the five areas of what was once called a 2020 vision – that in 2022 and beyond we would rely more fully on Jesus and together be able to live in this broken world with trust that Jesus is always with us, whether in good or bad times, and no matter what may come.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton | January 4

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805. After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today. St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."
