

FROM FR. JOEL Starting Strong toward our United Catholic Appeal Goals

Here in January, I take the opportunity to address our annual United Catholic Appeal (UCA) for multiple reasons. First of all, I want to thank you for your past contributions to this appeal that serves to provide finances for the Diocese of Duluth, particularly the ministries of Bishop Daniel Felton. I also want to briefly speak to why this appeal is necessary and how we benefit from it. Finally, I want to encourage making our giving toward the UCA a twelve-month endeavor in the interest of more easily reaching our goal each year.

In thanking you, I want to acknowledge that many of you did respond to the invitation for the end of the year push to meet our 2021 goals at each parish. At Sts. Mary and Joseph, we were able to meet the goal outright, with a small amount (about \$80) in excess of the 2021 goal being carried into the current year to start us off. At St. Francis, our final push helped us to significantly close the gap from where it was in the fall, and thanks to a special donation that was received, we were able to meet the goal without relying on our general operating income or our savings. Thus, both parishes met their goal for which I thank you.

Each year, each parish in the Diocese of Duluth is asked to donate to the United Catholic Appeal as the primary way to provide funding for the ministries of the diocese. Such funding aids the work of several departments of our local Church, including such areas as youth ministry, faith formation, The Northern Cross newspaper, the formation of deacons and future priests, the office of the marriage tribunal, and the office of worship.



FROM FR. JOEL (CONTINUED)

Above all, UCA provides directly for the ministry of the bishop – who in his capacity as shepherd of our local Church is able to carry out the tasks that specifically belong to him, which includes such areas as parish visits and the offering of the sacrament of confirmation at the parishes – noting here that he will be at Sts. Mary and Joseph next Sunday, January 30, for the 10:30 Mass to offer this sacrament to two young people. These funds are essential for the diocese as they are the primary source of income, as it is the UCA that serves the needs of the diocese in a parallel way as the weekly offerings aid the parishes in their works and ministries. Thus, it is necessary for each parish to offer what is asked for these ministries to be fully carried out.

While we will not receive our official 2022 UCA goals until the spring (these are usually given in April), we need not wait until then to begin contributing. Each year every parish is given a goal based upon what their own parish income is from the previous year. A figure of about 18-19% of the amount of previous year's parish ordinary income is usually the amount of the annual goal. Simply put, (and without knowing this year's goal), it is likely that our goals will be a number that is about 18-19% of what each parish received in regular Sunday and Holy Day collections last year. Thus, I expect (and yes, this an educated guess and **not** official) the 2022 goal for St. Francis to approximately be \$24,000-25,000; and for Sts. Mary and Joseph to be about \$8,500-9,000. That said, the numbers work out that if we all practice giving to UCA for all twelve months, doing so at a suggested rate of giving \$1 to UCA for every \$5 we give to the parish, we will meet our goal. As an example, for one who gives \$50 each month to the parish, their giving of \$10 each month all year long to UCA is consistent with the goal. Thus, I invite all to begin now and to adopt this "1 for 5 approach" for each month for the entire year – as this can make it so that we attain our goals naturally.

I thank you again for all of your generosity. May we continue to pray for our bishop and his ministry, and to generously support it through our intentional giving to UCA.

St. Thomas Aquinas | January 28

One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 – 1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "The Summa Theologiae." Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The Summa Theologiae, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today.
