# **Church Space Project Completions - Part Two**

When I first saw the artistic rendition of the proposed Living Wall, I must admit that my first spoken words were, "But they're not living plants?" After further research into the quality of the artificial plants (impressively designed, eco friendly and almost maintenance free) identified funding and further discussion on purpose and location, the project is ready to be completed. The size of the Living Wall on the displayed poster-board was huge. It was a covering of the wall just inside the main entrance. It had no purpose but decoration. The project was downsized to provide a much needed area for funeral visitations and for other pastoral needs in the narthex. Just behind the moveable ushers desk and the video display screen, there is a much smaller wall convenient to the entrance into the church.

The Living Wall will still have as it's defining feature the Cross of the Resurrection, currently located behind the altar. As the center of the Living Wall, the entire visual is the promise of the gift of eternal life in Christ - the central faith of all who gather to worship. With candle and flower stands to honor the casket or urn, kneeler and easels for photo boards, the Living Wall is a beautiful area for visitations before funerals. It is can also be arranged to be a wonderful backdrop for family photos or individual photos following First Communions, baptisms and weddings. I am greatly looking forward to the completion of this project this summer.

Meanwhile in St. Francis Hall there is a large crucifix in an even larger stand that has a history for some of our long-serving parishioners. Because of its size and weight, it will be temporarily placed in the reredos area as part of the sanctuary.

As I wrote in Part One, the Living Wall completes the projects I approved from among the 2019 recommendations. The two side altars, the other beautification projects in the narthex area, and a permanent crucifix for the sanctuary are put on hold while we focus on the AC and roof. In the fall, with a new pastoral and finance councils (my next two articles on Rebuilding With Grace) we can start the discussions for these future projects. Give it some thought and prayer, if you'd like. We'll welcome any ideas.

the sacrament of Confirmation from High School to the 8th grade with preparation beginning in 6th grade, Confirmation 1 in the 7th grade and Confirmation 2 in the 8th grade and the sacrament being received in the Spring of their 8th grade year. This is a transitional year where we will still have youth in high school who will still need to prepare and receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. This decision has come to light with much prayer and discernment as well as calling upon the Holy Spirit for guidance. Our young people today are in much need of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Confirmation enriches candidates with the strength of the Holy Spirit to renew and deepen their baptismal promises.

Confirmation preparation allows our young people to take an important step in their faith journey. It completes the initiation of our young Catholics and allows them to step forward in faith to witness to the truth and love of God in their lives. Confirmation is not a graduation, it is the doorway of becoming a fully initiated Catholic and gives the newly Confirmed the prompting to be a disciple and evangelist of the faith with the help and guidance of the holy spirit and the church. Our youth receive catechesis, provided with opportunities to share and discuss faith, and challenged to deepen their relationship with God. In addition to regular catechesis, young people are invited to expand their participation in the Church with intentional activities done as an individual and small groups.

Confirmation is an important step along one's faith journey, but it is by no means the end. It is our prayer that all those who receive Confirmation continue to foster their faith throughout their life.
