GOSPEL MEDITATION

John the Baptist sees Jesus coming toward him and announces, "Behold the lamb of God." His Jewish listeners knew what he meant. God's lamb is the thing that is sacrificed at the Jewish Passover and consumed by the participants. For almost a thousand years, lambs were ritually slaughtered and eaten in Jerusalem at Passover. The lamb meant sacrifice, freedom from sin, and communion with God. The Baptist is saying in effect, "This man will be ritually sacrificed and consumed so that God's people may be free from sin and united to God."

Dear parishioners, Welcome to the first bulletin in our new format! I hope

you like it. We'll see how it fits our needs. It's entirely likely that the new bulletin, even in its current form, will still evolve over time. I know there was never a pastor's column in the bulletin previously, but I was in the habit of writing one in my last assignment, and would like to continue to do so here. I hope this pastor's column will be especially helpful to our

parish members who aren't able to join us in person for Mass because of age or health or capacity to get around. It's my intention to reiterate a message from the readings or communicate here about other important matters.

With this weekend, we've now entered the winter period of Ordinary Time. It will go from this weekend until Sunday February 19th, when Lent begins that week with Ash Wednesday on Feb. 22nd. During this time, we'll hear about the beginning of the Lord's ministry throughout Israel. We'll also have several Sundays where the Gospel reading is part of Jesus' great Sermon on the Mount. The Church's goal here, with giving us the readings we have from both the Old and New Testaments, is to put us in touch with the person of Jesus – how He is foreshadowed in the Old Testament, and how He fulfills the foreshadowing in the New Testament. Our task is to learn Jesus – His heart, His message, His purpose, and ultimately through Him, the will of God.
