A Reflection from the Pastor <u>Father Shane Stoppel-Wasinger</u>

Last weekend, I began a four-week teaching, in regards to our Catholic Mass. My hope is that it may serve as a refresher, wake us up a bit, and who knows, you might even learn something new!

What exactly is the Mass? Often it is referred to as the "Liturgy", meaning the "work of the people". This means that *everyone* needs to be engaged, and not just sit back and observe. We sit, stand, kneel and respond together as one faith family.

People have often asked what exactly does a priest wear during mass. The first piece of clothing is called an Alb, usually white in color. Next, is the stole (looks like a scarf), which indicates the priest's role he serves and symbolizes his leadership for the People of God. The stole is purple during reconciliation, Advent and Lent. The stole is white during Baptism, marriage celebrations and funeral services. Lastly, is the outer garment called the vestment. This can also be referred to as a chasuble, descended from the Greeks and Romans around the 3rd century.

All Catholic churches have a Crucifix to remind us of Jesus' passion and love for us. This is often found hanging above an altar, as it does here at St. George. The Altar represents Christ, our cornerstone. The Hebrew word for "altar" comes from the word meaning "to slaughter" for sacrifice. Early Christians celebrated Mass at the grave sites of martyrs to honor them. That is how relics became associated with the altar. A relic is kept under each altar to remind us how our Christian ancestors celebrated Mass at those saintly graves. The picture below is where the relic is located in our altar. An altar is always in a sanctuary because it is considered a sacred space, and is usually raised.



Now, we all know the Sign of the Cross. This is the most common gesture of our Catholic faith, dating back to the 3^{rd} century. When we make the sign of the cross, we express our Christian faith and call upon divine protection and grace. The sign of the cross should also remind us of

Christ's death for us on the cross.

Did you know the original name for "Holy Water" was "Easter Water"? This is because the water is blessed at the Easter Vigil. Outside of the Easter season, a priest will also bless water used during a baptism. Holy water is to remind us of our own baptism and to rededicate ourselves as children of God. Holy water is also sprinkled at the Christian burial service, marking us with the beginning of eternal life.

Here is a little about our actions and postures during Mass. Did you know that when we genuflect (on one knee), this is considered an act of penance, prayer and also an act of veneration? If able, we should genuflect before a Holy Object, such as when we venerate before the wood of the Cross on Good Friday. Although it is not mandatory to genuflect, it remains an appropriate gesture to make in front of the Blessed Sacrament, whether it is being exposed during Adoration or it is in the tabernacle.

Have you ever wondered why we bow? It is another sign of respect. A profound bow from the waist should be done before an altar. A simple reverent bow, or nod, is done during the Creed when we are commemorating the Incarnation. Even standing is a sign of respect and readiness to engage during mass. Sitting signifies a passive posture of reflection and receptivity. And kneeling represents the posture of repentance, private adoration, and receptivity. Boy, we Catholics sure do get a work out! It surely helps with all the delicious treats that follow during hospitality!

Lastly, I discussed the four processions during Mass: The Entrance, Gospel, Offertory and Communion. A procession means an assembly on the move, united in their purpose and their destination. The movement reminds us that we are on an earthly pilgrimage. But we must remember, our earthly home is temporary; we are made for Heaven. We are actually exiles on Earth, and the Scriptures speak of this. The processions are meant to help us remember we are called to go *toward* God.




