### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

We like to think we are totally free, but the bitter truth is we simply are not. Or better put, our freedom is limited on every side — by governments, corporate giants, physical and mental frailties, genetic shortcomings, and even the boundaries of time and space, and above all, the burden of our sins and pending deaths. In our day, we are perhaps particularly aware that we are not free to disconnect from the technocratic rulers of the air. If you doubt me, try not paying your internet bill and see what happens. We are not totally free. It's nothing new, of course. In Jesus' day, everyone felt the crushing weight of the Roman Empire. You can say you're free all you want. But try not paying your taxes to Rome and see what happens.

Once we feel this burden in our own lives — however it comes — we are ready to hear the stunning announcement that commences Mark's gospel, "The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." It's not a simple perfunctory introduction, but a dramatic announcement of new freedom. The word "gospel" was a political, even military, term. It meant: a great victory has been won and a new king is in charge. This Jesus — not the Roman emperor — is God's son, and he has defeated all that crushes human freedom. It's time to follow him and be truly free. This week let's refuse to submit our freedom to false rulers — especially that of sin. And let's rejoice that Christ is coming to make us perfectly free from all our oppressors .


This year the Solemnity of Christmas falls on a Monday and is a **holyday of obligation.** All the faithful are obligated to participate in two Masses, from the anticipated Mass of the 4th Sunday of Advent on Saturday evening Dec. 23 through the evening of Dec. 25. In the "Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year and the Calendar," no. 34 states, "The Vigil Mass of the Nativity is used on the evening of December 24, either before or after First Vespers (Evening Prayer I). On the day of the Nativity of the Lord, following ancient Roman tradition, Mass may be celebrated three times, that is, in the night, at dawn, and during the day."

We will have our regular weekend Masses Saturday, Dec. 23 at 6 p.m. and Sunday, Dec. 24 at 10:30 a.m. for the Fourth Sunday of Advent.

#### **CHRISTMAS MASS SCHEDULE:**

Sunday, Dec. 24: 4 p.m., Pilot Grove; 5 p.m., Boonville; 6 p.m.: Clifton City; 8 p.m., Boonville.

Monday, December 25: 8 a.m., Clear Creek; 10 a.m., Boonville. The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, falls on a Monday (Jan. 1) and so is NOT a holyday of obligation. As a Solemnity, however, it



still outranks the Feast of the Holy Family, which will be celebrated that Sunday Dec. 31. Any Masses celebrated on the evening of Dec. 31 should be for Mary, Mother of God. — Fr. Dan Merz, DLC Chair

### "What exactly does 'honor your father and mother" encompass?" — Susan K., 17

A: First, it means obey your parents, for they exercise God-given authority over you. It also means to be grateful to your parents for the gift of life, and for you to care for your parents when they can no longer care for themselves.

Children should obey their parents so long as:

- parental wishes aren't contrary to the Catholic Faith;
- 2) The children live in their parents' home; or
- 3) Until they reach adulthood.

After that time, children are still obliged to love and honor their parents, but not necessarily obey them. By this time, the children are old enough to make their own decisions.

The Fourth Commandment also applies to more than the parent/child relationship. It calls us to obey lawful supervisors, including teachers, older siblings, and those who govern. Again, this assumes one is not directed to act contrary to the Faith. The Fourth Commandment also places a reciprocal duty on parents and those who exercise other forms of authority. Parents should educate and raise children in the Faith. They should respect their children as persons, disciplining them when necessary and providing for their physical, spiritual, educational, and social needs as best they can. In short, parents are obliged to love their children.

While it is true that many parish or school communities include gambling or games of chance in festivals and fundraisers (e.g. bingo, roulette,

ring tossing, dunking booths, etc.), there is nothing inherently wrong these sorts of events, given they are played

> fairly and within the limits of reason are not morally objectionable.

As the Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us: "Games of chance (card games, etc.) or wagers are not in themselves contrary to justice. They become morally unacceptable when they deprive someone of what is necessary to provide for his needs and those of others" (no. 2413).

As in all things, moderation and a sense of healthy limits should be applied to gambling and games of chance. For those who find themselves living with addiction to gambling, help is available in various 12-step and addiction recovery programs.




