

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Maybe I'm weird, but I like spending time in doctor's offices, confession lines in churches, auto repair shops, prison cells, and support groups of various kinds. It's refreshing to be with people who humbly admit something is wrong and forthrightly set out on a path toward a solution. When we ignore what is off kilter, we become alone and fragile. In places where people are honest and hopeful about brokenness, sturdy if subtle fellowship usually ensues. Consider the image we see of Jesus in the Gospel of Mark. "...they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by a demon. The whole town was gathered at the door." The entire human community is afflicted in various ways, and so it gradually forms a strange new community around Jesus. The healer from Nazareth is like a sun of health around which orbits a throng of humanity absorbing his healing rays. These blessed souls can't fix themselves and become healthy, and they know it. But they have found in Him the living source of all imaginable healing.

It's the Church, isn't it? A sin-sick community gathered and healed is what happens at the beginning of every Mass. We shuffle in through the door from everywhere and announce that we are not okay, and we can't fix it. In doing so, we are drawn into the orbit of the healing power of Christ — and into a renewed community with the whole human family. It's nothing to fear or rush. Maybe we can even learn to enjoy more how good it is to be in such a happy place.




NEWMAN'S MARDI GRAS FESTIVAL - FEBRUARY 10



WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED Is Gossip a Sin?

Question: Is gossip a mortal sin?

Answer: To really answer this question, we must consider the Eighth Commandment: "You shall not bear false witness."

In its reflections on this commandment, The Catechism of the Catholic Church invites us to not only think about what bearing "false witness" means, but to also consider how we understand the truth and how we communicate more broad-

This is why so much of this section of the Catechism has to do with the gift of language. With this in mind, we will notice that the word "gossip" isn't used by the Catechism. Instead, we find the words "detraction" and "calumny," which are actually two forms that gossip can take, and both can be quite serious. First, detraction is the of re-

vealing "another's faults and

failings to persons who did not

know them," without morally

valid reasons. Calumny, by extension, is saying something about another person that is untrue, and it is sinful because it "harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgements" (see no. 2477).

In all of our communication, we have to always recognize that we have a moral obligation to the truth and to always work to protect the reputation and honor of our neighbors (see no. 2479).

Gossip can, in fact, prove to be a very serious sin. After all, the Catechism reminds us: "No one is bound to reveal the truth to someone who does not have the right to know it" (no. 2489). When we have gossiped, especially if we are aware we have damaged another person's good name or reputation, we want to make every effort to undo the damage we have done, including seeking the grace and forgiveness offered in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.


Q: "How can youth leaders get Catholic teens more excited about God in their youth groups or Church? — Amy M., 16

A: As a former youth minister, I work with many kids who could be classified as "lukewarm." They didn't care too much about religion. They were bored in religious education classes. They were probably apathetic because they were not more convinced about the truths of the Faith.

I recommend trying to ge tthem fully convinced about just one issue, perhaps abortion. After they come to see that truth exists and that it is vitally important, you can then introduce them to other truths. You can convince them that "objective truth" exists and that we need to act on this truth. They will start to see the ridiculousness of the "live and let live" mentality. How can one sit by as millions of babies are killed each year in abortion? An energetic, even mildly confrontational faith will excite them. They you can introduce them to a deeper sacramental and contemplative approach to the Faith.


