GOSPEL MEDITATION

Outside Chicago, there is a small cemetery in the woods behind Mundelein Seminary, where I was a student. One night I was exploring it. I looked up and was shocked to see an imposing 17-foot angel towering over me and preparing to blow a trumpet. Adrenaline rushed through me. I gasped and uttered, "Oh my God!" Quickly I realized it was in fact a massive bronze statue. I tried to calm myself down. But it still freaked me out. As we begin to celebrate Easter today, this image might seem a bit unnerving. But please recall that for the first disciples on the morning of the resurrection, it was precisely that. It wasn't joyful at first, it was terrifying. It wasn't peaceful, it was unsettling. In that Jerusalem cemetery, something otherworldly had happened. Angels announced that He was no longer dead, but alive. They had blown their trumpets, so to speak, and Jesus had risen. Soon the

We all have our own places of the dead, too, don't we? Deceased loved ones. Our tired patterns of blame. Relationships stuck in resentment. Indifference to the poor. Lost dreams. Despair about our future. Fear of sickness and death. These are our "cemeteries" where we don't expect much to happen. Today we enter — if we dare — those places with the disciples. See the mighty angel standing there, trumpet ready to blare! — *Father John Muir*

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED Communion Wafer

Question: Do Catholics always need to receive communion in wafer form, or can it be different kinds of bread?

Answer: In the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church, the most common form for the eucharistic bread is the small white communion "wafer" that is a ubiquitous part of the Catholic Mass.

The instructions of the Church have been very specific regarding the make-up of the bread used in the Mass: "The bread used in the celebration of the Most Holy Eucharistic Sacrifice must be unleavened, purely of wheat, and recently made ... it follows therefore that bread made from another substance, even if it is grain, or if it is mixed with another substance different from wheat to such an extent that it would not commonly be considered wheat bread, does not constitute valid matter for confecting the Sacrifice and the Eucharistic Sacrament" (see **Redemptionis Sacramentum**

by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, no. 48). The Church's tradition of using a wheat-based bread is based on the bread that Jesus would have used at the Last Supper and is considered to be an essential part of the "matter" of the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

As we consider the question of whether a "wafer" — which is properly called a "host" should be used, we also must keep in mind that in the Eastern Rites of the Catholic Church, leavened (i.e. "raised") bread is more often used.

And so, while the thin, white "wafer" is most commonly used in the Roman Rite of the Church, the full expression of the Catholic tradition does allow for a more substantial form of bread to be used, but the tradition of using a simple wheat bread with no other additions or additives is considered essential.



Q: "Doesn't God forgive you no matter what? Therefore, isn't Confession unnecessary?" — Emily F., 15

A: What you're asking is, "Doesn't God just 'look the other way' when we sin?" Or, if He really loves us, why does He let our sings get in the way of our relationship with Him? Why does He demand repentance first? Why can't He forgive us unconditionally?

The answer is that forgiveness, by its very nature, requires acceptance on the part of the one forgiven in order to be complete. The goal of forgiveness is reconciliation. The person who admits no fault can accept no forgiveness for it and cannot be reconciled with the one he has offended by his action.

God cannot just "ignore" our sin because He is holy. Also, because sin hurts us, God won't expression of God's love for us, allow us to be hurt unnecessarily. He loves us too much to leave us in our sin. The only way out is repentance.

Furthermore, sin itself keeps us from God, who is our ultimate happiness, so long as we are unrepentant. If we think of sin as merely breaking the rules, especially rules seen as arbitrarily laid down by God, then it is hard to understand why God can't just "look the other way." But if sin is understood as preferring some lesser good (something else or someone else, including ourselves) to God, the supreme Good, then God's love for us demands that He set us straight. He requires us to turn back to Him — for our sake, not His. God wants us to turn our hearts from the lesser good to Himself, our supreme Good. The Sacrament of Confession is the normal means God has established for us to come back to Him if we sin seriously after Baptism. Confession is an for He knows our hearts and our need to confess.


