

First Reading: When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. (Acts 1:9)

Psalm: God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord. (Ps 47)

Or: Alleluia.

Second Reading: But grace was given to each of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. (Eph 4:7)

Gospel: So then the Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them, was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God. (Mk 16:19)

GOSPEL MEDITATION

When I was a kid, my parents took me to the circus, and I was mesmerized by the acrobats. I recall one show in which the trapeze artists would swoop down just above the ground and then launch up into the air, flinging their bodies seemingly to the top of the tent, all at dizzying speeds. It wasn't just their height but their dangerous proximity to the ground that thrilled me.

Perhaps that's a little how St. Mark wants us to feel as he describes the Ascension of Jesus. He tells us that Jesus "sat down at table with them" and then, just a few lines later, "he ascended into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God." He dies, he rises! He sits down, he ascends! What do these divine acrobatics teach us?

The depth and height on display are a show of his love for us. When Jesus "sat down" he "upbraided them for their lack of faith and stubbornness of heart." He dangerously swoops down into our lowly place of fragmentation, disbelief, and death. When he ascends, he confirms their preaching with signs of powerful healing. The height of heaven is the place from which God brings wholeness, faith, and life. The point is the Ascension of Jesus is not about his departure. It is about the feat by which he unites the heavens and the earth, the highest and the lowest.

We are meant to relive this spiritually dizzying experience in every Mass, when Jesus sits down with us at his Eucharistic table and then offers himself up to the Father with and for us. Ladies and gentlemen, boys and girls: welcome to the great tent of the Church! Feast your eyes on the divine and human acrobat whose saving feat is the great thrill of our lives






There will opportunities to walk:



Q: "How do you determine if you can receive Communion or not?" — Angela R., 15

A: By examining your conscience to determine, as best you can, whether you are in a state of grace — whether you have committed any mortal sins that have not been confessed. If you are in a state of grace, you can and should receive the Eucharist. If you are not, you should not receive it. To do so would be the sin of sacrilege.

As you grow in the spiritual life, you will generally find it easier to determine whether you have committed any mortal sins. In the meantime, here is a quick lesson on what constitutes a mortal sin. A mortal sin is a grievous offense against God that deprives the sinner of sanctifying grace, which is the supernatural life of the soul. It also makes the person an enemy of God, takes away all the merits of one's good actions and deprives one of the

sanctifying grace necessary for salvation. To commit a mortal (or deadly) sin, these are three conditions that must be present:

- The thought, word, action or omission must be seriously wrong or considered seriously wrong;
- The sinner needs to know it is seriously wrong; and
- 3) The sinner must give full consent of the will in choosting the sin.

Copies of "Examination of Conscience" are available at each of the church entrances. Take one and keep it with you. This will help you examine your conscience to determine whether you have committed a serious offense against God. As you become more sensitive to God's laws (which comes from prayer, study, and frequent reception of the Sacraments), you will know almost immediately when you have committed a serious offense.

Bishop W. Shawn McKnight will celebrate the feast of Mary, Mother of the Church, at the National Shrine of Mary, Mother of the Church with a Mass on Monday, May 20 at 6:30 p.m. The Mass will be celebrated at the outdoor shrine, which is adjacent to St. Patrick Catholic Church, 176 Marian Drive in Laurie.

In 2018, Pope Francis gifted the Church with a new feast day: The Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, to be celebrated each year on the day after Pentecost.

The title "Mother of the Church" dates back to the fourth century writings of St. Ambrose of Milan, though. In 1968, Pope Paul VI gave official recognition of the title when he wrote, "The Blessed Mother of God, the New Eve, Mother of the Church, continues in heaven her maternal role with regard to Christ's members, cooperating with the birth and growth of divine life in the souls of the redeemed."

With the summer season beginning Memorial Day weekend, all are invited to worship with the community of the Mothers' Shrine on Saturdays at 8 p.m. and Sundays 8:30 a.m.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED:

Ascension of the Lord

Question: Couldn't Jesus have done more good if he stayed on earth, rather than ascended into heaven?

Answer: This is an interesting question! During his earthly life, Jesus gave sight to the blind, healed paralytics, drove out demons, and fed thousands with only a few loaves of bread. Imagine what he could have done if he'd never ascended into heaven! Imagine what our world could be! It's an interesting thought to consider, especially as the world faces challenges that only seem to deepen and expand. Yet at the Last Supper, Jesus says, "It is better for you if I go." Why? His response must have seemed strange to the Apostles at the time. In his place, Jesus says, he will send the Paraclete, the Comforter, the Advocate. He promises to send the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' departure allows the Apostles to become the leaders he has formed them to be. Jesus is no longer situated in only one geographical location, and his Church will never be a political kingdom. Soon after the Ascension, we celebrate Pentecost — the descent of the Holy Spirit and the radical empowerment of the followers of Jesus. We share in that empowerment

and in that mission. Jesus is present in the sacraments, and he is present in us. Through our faith, hope, and love, we are called to be the good he does here on earth!




