

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

When I was twenty-two years of age in August of 2000, I experienced World Youth Day in Rome. As for many of my generation, the event was life-changing for me. Surrounded by joyful, hope-filled young people from seemingly every nation and tongue, we were gathered around the Pope, sharing a common Faith and love. The Pope spoke to us of our shared family bond in the Church and invited us to give our lives in service to others. Now twenty-four years later, my life as a priest, like that of so many others from those special days, continues on that same path of love and unity — despite my many weaknesses. What makes that continuation possible?

This week's feast gives the answer: the Holy Spirit. The gift of God — His very life — the third person of the Trinity, is the Spirit who animates the entire Church and each member of it. He makes us one-in-love in a way that utterly exceeds human capacity. For example, he makes the apostles speak with tongues of fire, and everyone hears them in his own native tongue. The Holy Spirit is the means by which Jesus establishes a new family, one that crosses all possible boundaries of time, space, and culture. The Holy Spirit never tires in enthusing us for mission.

Aren't we longing to experience the Holy Spirit in a fresh way? Today we celebrate this untiring flame, once ignited on earth and burning still. So, we humbly cry out: Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and enkindle in us the fire of your love!


## There will opportunities to walk:



In the Gospel of John, we see the powerful scene in which Jesus gives to the Church his final gift. "Behold, your mother!" John 19-27). Here we see Jesus inaugurating Mary's role as mother of the Church. Therefore, it should be no surprise that from the very earliest time of the Church, Christians have turned to Mary as their spiritual mother for her prayers and her motherly help.

Q: "At Mass, how is the bread and wine God's body and blood? When I see the bread, I don't see flesh or skin. Also, the wine is not thick enough to be blood." — John D., 14

A: You're right that in the Eucharist we don't see the flesh and blood of Christ in their natural forms. That's because the Eucharist is a *sacrament*, which means it's a *sign*. The *sign* can be discerned (seen, heard, felt, tasted or touched), but not Christ's actual flesh. So, we have to have faith in the invisible reality.

For example, you can't see your sins being forgiven in Baptism. All you can see is water being poured on you (and all you "feel" is wet.) Yet, we really and truly have our sins removed with Baptism. We can discern (feel) the water. We have to have faith to believe that the forgiveness of sins actually took place.

In the case of the Eucharist, all we see are the appearances of bread and wine, rather than the invisible reality, which is Christ's glorified body and blood (as well as His soul and divinity).

Things we encounter have "substance"

and "accidents." "Substance" refers to the thing itself that exists *in itself* rather than an as *aspect* of something *else*. A tree, a car, a human being are "substances" in this sense. But these things also have certain qualities or characteristics that don't exist on their own but *in* them. Think of it this way: A tree may have green

leaves or brown. A car may be red or green. A human may be tall or short, etc. These characteristics are real, but they don't exist on their own; they exist as attributes of other things. We never, for instance, run into "redness" or "tallness." These qualities exist, but only in other things that are red or tall — that car or that boy. We call such qualities the accidents (in technical language, not in the ordinary sense of the word, i.e., something unintended).

Another example: a house is substance; the paint adhering to the house is an accident. If we paint the house another color, we've changed the accident but kept the substance. The house is still a house. It doesn't change to a tree or a car. Now the Eucharist is like that; it has both

substance and accidents. When the priest consecrates the Eucharist, the accidents of bread and wine remain while their substance is changed into the body and blood of Christ. It looks like bread and tastes like bread, but has really and truly changed to the Body and Blood of Christ. Ordinarily, a change of substance would mean a change in accidents, for the accidents of a thing usually go along with the substance. But in the Eucharist we do not see a change in the accidents because God maintains the accidents of bread and wine (the color, shape, taste, smell, etc.) despite changing their substance to that of the Body and Blood of Christ.

Why does God retain the accidents of bread and wine?

First, to remind us that Christ is the source of our spiritual, as well as physical, life using the appearance of bread and wine, which help give us physical life. (God often links the physical and spiritual together like that.)

Second, to become one with us physically

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED: Holy Spirit

**Question**: How do we know when we receive the Holy Spirit?

Answer: My brothers and I discovered something as we got older. There's a little bit of dad in us. Each time we catch ourselves using one of his gestures, expressions, or comments about a meal, we say, "I'm getting more like Dad!" Many laughs and good-natured kidding have come out of it. Mom loves it, and so does Dad, although I doubt he'd admit it! When we are confirmed, we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit. There is no radical change in us that makes us seem suddenly different.

Over a period of time, we come to see

that there is a little bit of the Spirit in us. We catch ourselves using the gifts, and often end up wondering where a bit of wisdom came from, or why we were so patient, or we feel an intensity in our prayer. Perhaps we felt drawn to deepen

our spiritual life or found courage in witnessing to our faith. That's when we know we have received the Holy Spirit. We take on his image. Yes, we grow in age, grace and wisdom, but we also grow in our awareness and understanding of the working of God in our life. We become more godlike, realizing we're getting more and more like God. Our thoughts, words and actions carry that quality and others too, see it in us. You might call it holiness. But be confident! There's a little bit of him in all of us.

(as we eat the Eucharistic elements) as a means of joining with us spiritually communion. (He can do that with the accidents of bread and wine, which can be taken into our bodies to become part of us.)

Third, to link the Eucharist to His covenant with the Jewish people, for the elements of bread and wine are taken from the Passover meal of the

Hebrews.

Fourth, to link the Eucharist with every meal, where when the food is blessed, we acknowledge God as Lord of our lives and of creation. The Eucharist is the supreme act of acknowledgement, for in it we offer God's supreme gift to us, Jesus, back to Him. And with the Eucharist, we also offer ourselves to God.




