GOSPEL MEDITATION

Once I was at a meeting with representatives of various religions. On a coffee break, a man from another religion mused to me: "You know, with all our differences, all religions are really about being good people." I lowered my cappuccino and said as warmly as I could, "That's not what mine's about." His quizzical look begged for clarification. "Mine is about plunging into the life of God," I said.

Just before Jesus ascends into heaven, he commands the eleven apostles, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20). The word "baptize" means "to immerse in, to plunge into." It presupposes the use of water. But what does it mean to be immersed in God's name? In the Bible, God's name is identical to God Himself. So, to be baptized into water, using Jesus' formula, is to be plunged into the life of God. Said another way, it is to die with Jesus and rise with him as a member of his body. The Trinity isn't a doctrine simply to accept and ponder. It's more like an ocean: a mystery into which we are baptized ... inserted, immersed, dunked, plunged. Baptism gives us power to live our lives as beloved children of God, patterned after Jesus himself, who is always with us, until the end of the ages. Hardly the same as being good people. Stranger, but much better.

With more than 20 volunteers showing up to work hard Saturday morning, May 11, a huge number of improvements and maintenance projects were accomplished at the church cemetery and in the landscaping at church. Everything looks FANTASTIC! At the cemetery:

- Sticks & trash were picked up.
- Grass around the headstones was trimmed, swept, blownoff and otherwise cleaned up.
- Recently dug graves were

leveled, raked and seeded.

- In the grotto area around Jesus: rock was moved in the flower beds, a weed mat put down, rose bushes were pruned and other vegetation planted. The landscape edging was painted. The dirt buildup on the state of Jesus was scraped off.
- Workers in the shed counted the available grave site flags, separating out the ones needing to be retired. Those flags were sent to Deputy Schanzmeyer. Additional flags were ordered for our





veterans' gravesites.

- The shed was organized, swept out and trash was disposed of.
- Additionally, the peeling paint on the shed was scraped round the door and the roof trim, prepping it for a fresh coat of paint.
- Meanwhile, at church, Mary Lea Reuter and crew tackled the landscaping, continuing efforts to enhance these areas.






Rohrbach, and he received additional support from friends who comprise a group of faithful young men. May the Holy Spirit continue to work in big ways through you, Eric! God bless!

The Most Holy

of Christ

Q: "Do any other Christian faiths have communion?" — Elisabeth G., 18

A: Most Christian churches have some form of communion. But, excluding a few

rare exceptions, only the Eastern Orthodox, have the same Eucharist as the Roman Catholic Church — the Body and Blood of Christ made present under the "appearances" of bread and wine. Like Catholic priests, Orthodox priests have apostolic succession and valid priestly orders, so they are able to change bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ.

Most Anglicans (and their American counterparts,

Episcopalians) and Lutherans believe in a form of the Real Presence — that Jesus' body

and blood are Body and Blood present along with the "substance" of bread and wine — a view the Catholic

> Church rejects. Most Evangelical or Fundamentalist Protestants deny any form of "Real Presence" of Jesus in Communion. They teach that Jesu is either only "spiritually" present, as He is at other times when Christians gather, or symbolically present, with the bread and wine simply representing Him. The Catholic Church also rejects these views as incomplete at best.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED: Deacons

Question: At a parish council meeting, our pastor mentioned the need for deacons. It is something I am considering. How do I know if I have a vocation? What steps should I take next?

Answer: Any and all gifts that the Holy Spirit gives to the church are for the good of the community. As members of the Body of Christ, what one member does affects all. What the body does also affects each member. A vocation or call to ministry is tested and verified by the church. Through prayer, instruction, and service, a vocation is tested, and then

acknowledged by the official

call to orders or to service. If you are considering becoming a deacon, the first step would be to talk to your pastor. He will be able to give you more specific information on the program in your diocese, what is expected of you, and how you apply. You might also begin to see a spiritual director, someone who can help you with your faith journey and vocation discernment. They do so by focusing on prayer, your relationship with God, and spiritual practices. Finally, you'll need to see the diocesan vocation director in charge of deacons to apply. Best wishes!


